#### 6. Agreements and Letters of Consent:

Detailed justification as to why Section 48 powers are required

Approximately [37] km of the entire underground cable is being laid in the public road. EirGrid plc requires the statutory powers conferred on ESB under Section 51 of the Electricity Supply Act 1927 to lay the interconnector under the road. Such powers may be conferred on EirGrid plc as a holder of an authorisation to construct an interconnector under Section 16 (b) of the Electricity Regulation Act 1999 pursuant to Section 48 of the Electricity Regulation Act 1999.

In addition to having received the consent of Cork County Council regarding aspects of the project which concern all relevant roads, EirGrid has received consent from Cork County Council to locate the cable at lands in their ownership at Claycastle Beach.
