

Board Direction BD-003161-19 ABP-303713-19

The submissions on this file and the Inspector's report were considered at a Board meeting held on May 28th, 2019.

The Board decided to grant permission generally in accordance with the Inspector's recommendation, for the following reasons and considerations, and subject to the following conditions.

Appropriate Assessment Screening

The Board noted that the development that is the subject of this application is not directly connected with or necessary to the management of a European Site. In completing the screening for Appropriate Assessment, the Board noted the Appropriate Assessment Screening report submitted with the application. The Board accepted and adopted the screening assessment carried out in the Inspector's report and her conclusion in respect of the identification of the European sites which could potentially be affected, and the identification and assessment of the likely significant effects of the subject development, either individually or in combination with other plans or projects, on Lough Ree Special Area of Conservation (site code 000400) and the Lough Ree Special Protection Area (site code 004064), in view of the conservation objectives and qualifying interests of these two European sites. The Board was satisfied that the subject development, either individually or in combination with other plans or projects, would not be likely to have had, or to have, a significant effect on the aforementioned European sites, in view of their conservation objectives and qualifying interests, and adopted the inspector's report in this regard.

Reasons and Considerations

Having regard to the nature, scale and form of the proposed development and the established use of the site for agricultural purposes, it is considered that, subject to compliance with the conditions set out below, the development for which retention is sought would not be likely to have had, and would not have, a significant effect on any European site, in view of the conservation objectives and qualifying interests of such sites, would not lead to a risk of increased flooding and would, therefore, be in accordance with the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.

Conditions

1.	The development shall be retained in accordance with the plans and

	Reas	eason: In the interest of clarity.			
2.	The constructed farm roadway shall be used for agricultural purpose				
	and shall not be used to facilitate domestic access unless authorised by a				
	subs	subsequent grant of permission.			
	Reas	eason: In the interest of clarity and orderly development.			
3.	Withi	in 3 months of the date of this order, the following shall be submitted			
	to the planning authority:				
	(a)	Details of the pipes that have been constructed under the access			
		road;			
	(b)	Arrangements for the maintenance of these pipes to ensure			
		connectivity between land parcels east and west of the roadway;			
	(c) Back planting of the roadway with native indigenous hedgerow				
	including a timescale for implementation. Planting shall be				

undertaken in the first planting season following the date of this Order. Planting shall be maintained thereafter and any plants that die, become diseased or are removed shall be replaced within the following planting season by plants of a similar size and species.

Reason: In the interest of visual amenity and nature conservation.
