The submissions on this file (including the applicant's response to the Board's section 131 notice) and the Inspector's report were considered at a further Board meeting held on 11/11/2020.

The Board decided to refuse permission for the following reasons and considerations.

Reasons and Considerations

Having regard to the location of the site within a rural area under urban influence, and to National Policy Objective 19 of the National Planning Framework (February 2018) which, for rural areas under urban influence, seeks to facilitate the provision of single housing in the countryside based on the core consideration of demonstrable economic or social need to live in a rural area, having regard to the viability of smaller towns and rural settlements, it is considered that the applicant has not demonstrated an economic or social need to live in a rural area having regard to the viability of smaller towns and rural settlements and, therefore, the proposed development would not comply with National Policy Objective 19. The proposed development would contribute to the encroachment of random rural development in the area, would militate against the preservation of the rural environment and the efficient provision of public services and infrastructure and would contravene the provisions of the National Planning Framework. The proposed development would, therefore, be contrary to the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.

In deciding not to accept the inspector's recommendation to grant permission, the
Board considered that, notwithstanding the provisions of Objective RCI 4-2 of the
Cork County Development Plan 2014-2021, the applicant has not demonstrated an
economic or social need to live in a rural area having regard to the viability of smaller
towns and rural settlements and, therefore, the proposed development would not
comply with National Policy Objective 19
