

## **Board Direction BD-007596-21 ABP-308145-20**

Re: Amending Board Order
S146A of the Planning and Development Act, 2000, as amended

The submissions on this file were considered at a Board meeting held on 24/02/2021.

The Board decided to exercise its powers under section 146A(1)(b) of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, to amend its Order of the 10<sup>th</sup> day of February 2021 for the purposes of correcting a clerical error therein.

It is considered that amendment of the Board Order would not result in a material alteration of the terms of the development, the subject of the permission or decision.

Having regard to the nature of the issue involved, the Board decided not to invite submissions in relation to the matter from any person who had made submissions or observations to the Board in relation to the permission/other matter.

Accordingly the Board hereby amends the above-mentioned decision by amending condition 2 in accordance with the provisions of section 146A(1) of the Planning and Development Act, 2000, as amended, as follows:

Before development commences the developer shall pay the sum of
 €229,838.40 (two hundred and twenty nine thousand and eight hundred and
 thirty eight euro and forty cent) to the Planning Authority as a contribution in
 respect of public infrastructure and facilities benefiting development in the
 area of the Planning Authority.

The contribution sought is in accordance with Wicklow County Council's Development Contribution Scheme for the area in which the site is located and Section 48(1) of the Planning and Development Act 2000.

Where the contribution remains unpaid the monies payable shall be updated in accordance with the Wholesale Price Index as published by the Central Statistics Office on the 1<sup>st</sup> January of each year following the date of the Final Grant.

**Reason**: The public infrastructure and facilities included in the Development Contribution Scheme will facilitate the development and it is considered reasonable that the developer should contribute towards the cost thereof.
