At a meeting held on 04/07/2024, the Board considered:

- (a) the objections made to the Compulsory Purchase Order,
- (b) the documents and submissions on file generally.

The Board decided to refuse consent to the compulsory acquisition of the said site based on the reasons and considerations set out below.

Reasons and Considerations:

Having regard to the current unsightly and objectionable condition of the site, having considered the objection made to the compulsory acquisition, and also:

- a) The Constitutional and Convention protection afforded to property rights,
- b) The public interest, and
- c) The Provisions of the Limerick Development Plan 2022-2028

It is considered that the site does not detract to a material degree from the amenity, character and appearance of land in the neighbourhood and, therefore that the compulsory acquisition of the site by the Local Authority is not necessary in order to render the site non-derelict. The Board is not satisfied, therefore, that the objection cannot be sustained, having regard to that said necessity and that the compulsory acquisition and its effects on the property rights of effected landowners are proportionate to that objective and justified by the exigencies of the common good
