

## **Board Direction BD-018368-24 ABP-320927-24**

At a meeting held on 02/12/2024, the Board considered:

- (a) the objections made to the Compulsory Purchase Order,
- (b) the report of the Inspector who held the oral hearing and
- (c) the documents and submissions on file generally.

The Board decided to GRANT consent to the compulsory acquisition of the said site based on the reasons and considerations set out below.

## Reasons and Considerations

Having regard to the neglected, unsightly and objectionable condition of the subject property incuding the exposed utilities and the visible presence of considerable weed growth on the concrete plinth and walls within the property, having considered the objections made to the compulsory acquisition, and also:

- (a) the constitutional and Convention protection afforded to property rights,
- (b) the public interest, and,
- (c) the provision of Waterford City and County Development Plan 2022-2028,

it is considered that the site detracts to a material degree from the amenity, character and appearance of land in the neighbourhood and, therefore, comes within the definition of a derelict site as defined in Section 3 (b) of the Derelict Sites Act, 1990, as amended, and that the acquisition of the site by the local authority is necessary in

order to render the site non-derelict and to prevent it continuing to be a derelict site. It is also considered that the objection made cannot be sustained, having regard to that said necessity and that the compulsory acquisition and its effects on the property rights of affected landowners are proportionate to that objective and justified by the exigencies of the common good.
