

Re: Proposed Solar Farm at Timahoe North, Ballydermot, County Kildare Strategic Infrastructure Development (SID) Determination

Dear Sir/Madam,

I refer to the pre-application consultation meeting held in relation to this project on the 7^{th} of March 2018, between the Board and the applicant of the proposed solar photovoltaic array, substation and associated grid connection development at Timahoe North, Ballydermot, County Kildare.

Comments on Issued Written Records of Meetings:

Firstly, on behalf of our clients Bord Na Móna Powergen Ltd, we wish to acknowledge receipt of the written record of the previous meeting that have been issued from the Board and confirm this is an accurate record of the meeting. In particular we note the following statements from the record of the meeting –

- "The Board will serve formal notice at the conclusion of the process as to whether or not the proposed development is SID. It may form a preliminary view at an early stage in the process as to whether the proposed development would be likely to constitute strategic infrastructure".
- "On behalf of the Board it was stated that the fact that an EIAR is required did not necessarily mean that the development is strategic infrastructure"
- "The Board also sought clarification as to whether the overhead line would function as a transmission line and it was confirmed that this was so and it would be part of the transmission network. It was noted that this in itself could have strategic infrastructure implications"
- "The applicant affirmed that it would be their preference to present as a single application i.e. rather than end up with one part pf the development being strategic development and the other part being a planning application to the planning authority. The applicant stated that they would like to get this clarified from the Board as soon as possible. As such although there are thresholds applying to wind-farm development (which result into whether they are classified as strategic infrastructure) the same does not apply to solar-

farm developments. The Board also stated that although the splitting of projects is not ideal it would be for the Board of An Bord Pleanála to give its opinion on this. The electricity transmission element of the proposed development might constitute SI but the solar farm element would not appear to be a class of development set out in the Seventh Schedule."

■ The Board indicated that it would consult with Eirgrid in this respect [i.e. whether the proposed substation would be on the electricity transmission network] and to ascertain their views."

Formal Request to Close S182E Discussions

In light of the comprehensive studies that have been carried out and clarifying discussions that have taken place with the Board and other stakeholders in relation to this project, the perspective applicant now wishes to formally close pre-application consultation process and requests that the Board now close out the S182E discussions and advise how it wishes the prospective applicant to proceed in relation to this application under the provisions of the Planning and Development Act, 2000, as amended.

Although arguments were presented in our initial submission to the Board seeking to have the entirety of the proposal considered as a single application, the discussions with the Board have highlighted the issues of precedence and consistency that such a single application approach would present within the planning process. Therefore, while a single application approach would be preferable, the prospective applicant is aware that the most likely outcome is that a two-application process will have to be undertaken. In this regard, our understanding is that the 110kV substation and associated 110kV infrastructure will require a direct application to An Bord Pleanála (under Section 182A of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 as amended) with the remainder of the proposed development (i.e. solar array, battery storage and associated infrastructure) constituting a standard application to the Planning Authority (Kildare County Council).

This likely outcome has been further enforced following our discussions with the Board and our own further engagement with Eirgrid, who have confirmed that the proposed substation development meets the definition of 'transmission' in accordance with the Electricity Regulation Act 1999. In this regard I refer to the attached email correspondence with Eirgrid. Accordingly, it is considered that, under Section 182(A) of the Planning and Development Act, the proposed provision of high voltage lines and electric plant (sub-station) will constitute Section 182A development, and therefore consent must be sought from the Board.

As the prospective applicant is anxious to proceed with the proposed development we wish to expedite the Boards decision in relation to confirming the S182A status or otherwise of the proposed development to allow this project to proceed to the planning application phase without any undue delay.

It is therefore requested that An Bord Pleanala close the pre-application consultation phase of this project and issue its formal determination, confirming our approach as set out above. We have also provided a layout map to inform the Board of the likely application boundary for a future direct planning application to An Bord Pleanala, which will comprise of any 110kV infrastructure. The remainder of the required infrastructure will be included in the application to the Planning Authority.

While the applicant originally considered that the project should comprise a single application, we now accept the proposed development will be required to be in two parts as set out above. As both applications will comprise of constituent parts of a single overall project, which has an Environmental Impact Assessment requirement, due to thresholds under Part 2 of Schedule 5 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended) being exceeded (Class 1(d)(iii) -

deforestation, and Class 10(dd) - road length in excess of 2km), we will be providing an Environmental Impact Assessment Report with both applications.

Conclusion

As set out above, on behalf of our client we wish to formally close the pre-application consultation phase of this project and are requesting that the Board issue its formal determination in relation to the above-mentioned project in light of the proposed addition consultations with Eirgrid, as detailed above.

As both McCarthy Keville O'Sullivan Ltd. and the prospective applicants are familiar with the planning processes involved in S182A developments and with the Strategic Infrastructure Developments we are happy to receive any further details of procedures in written form and would therefore request and anticipate that a further meeting with the Board will not be necessary in relation to the proposed development.

I trust the above is to your satisfaction
