

Board Order ABP-306365-20

Planning and Development Acts 2000 to 2019

Planning Authority: Fingal County Council

Planning Register Reference Number: F19A/0247.

Appeal by Daniela Sirbu care of Rogers Brassil Associates of 72 Albert Road Lower, Sandycove, Dún Laoghaire, County Dublin against the decision made on the 5th day of December, 2019 by Fingal County Council to refuse permission for the proposed development.

Proposed Development: (a) Demolition of the existing sub-standard bungalow on site, (b) Retention of the unauthorized footprint of foundations and concrete floor slab (63.5 square metres) as constructed, excluding the rear element (11 square metres) now to be a re-constructed as permeably paved patio (11 square metres) and (c) construction of a detached, flat-roofed, two-storey dwelling (127 square metres) on the footprint (63.5 square metres) to be retained, including a side gate off Sandy Lane and all associated site works at Moss Cottage, Sandy Road, Rush, County Dublin.

Decision

GRANT permission for the above proposed development in accordance with the said plans and particulars based on the reasons and considerations under and subject to the conditions set out below.

Matters Considered

In making its decision, the Board had regard to those matters to which, by virtue of the Planning and Development Acts and Regulations made thereunder, it was required to have regard. Such matters included any submissions and observations received by it in accordance with statutory provisions.

Reasons and Considerations

Having regard to the scale and design of the proposed dwelling and the provisions of the Fingal Development Plan 2017-2023, it is considered that, subject to compliance with the conditions set out below, the proposed dwelling would not be considered overbearing, would integrate in a satisfactory manner with the existing built development in the area, would not form a discordant feature on the streetscape and would adequately protect the residential amenity of adjacent property. The proposed development and the development for which retention is sought would, therefore, be in accordance with the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.

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Conditions

1. The development shall be carried out, completed and retained in accordance with the plans and particulars lodged with the application, except as may otherwise be required in order to comply with the following conditions. Where such conditions require details to be agreed with the planning authority, the developer shall agree such details in writing with the planning authority prior to commencement of development and the development shall be carried out, completed and retained in accordance with the agreed particulars.

Reason: In the interest of clarity.

Details including samples of the materials, colours and textures of all the
external finishes to the proposed building shall be submitted to, and
agreed in writing with, the planning authority prior to commencement of
development.

Reason: In the interest of visual amenity.

3. The flat roof elements of the property shall not be used as a terrace, balcony or for any similar purpose.

Reason: In the interest of residential amenity.

4. Development described in Classes 1 or 3 of Part 1 of Schedule 2 to the

Planning and Development Regulations, 2001, or any statutory provision

modifying or replacing them, shall not be carried out within the curtilage

of the proposed dwellinghouse without a prior grant of planning

permission.

Reason: In the interest of residential amenity.

5. Water supply and drainage arrangements, including the attenuation and

disposal of surface water, shall comply with the requirements of the

planning authority for such works and services.

Reason: In the interest of public health.

6. Prior to commencement of development, the developer shall enter into

water and/or wastewater connection agreement(s) with Irish Water.

Reason: In the interest of public health.

7. All public service cables for the development, including electrical and

telecommunications cables, shall be located underground throughout the

site.

Reason: In the interest of visual amenity.

8. The construction of the development shall be managed in accordance with a Construction Management Plan, which shall be submitted to, and agreed in writing with, the planning authority prior to commencement of development. This plan shall provide details of intended construction practice for the development, including noise and dust management measures and off-site disposal of construction/demolition waste.

Reason: To protect the amenities of the area.

9. Site development and building works shall be carried out only between the hours of 0800 to 1900 Mondays to Fridays inclusive, between 0800 to 1400 hours on Saturdays and not at all on Sundays and public holidays. Deviation from these times will only be allowed in exceptional circumstances where prior written approval has been received from the planning authority.

Reason: To protect the amenities of the area.

10. The developer shall pay to the planning authority a financial contribution in respect of public infrastructure and facilities benefiting development in the area of the planning authority that is provided or intended to be provided by or on behalf of the authority in accordance with the terms of the Development Contribution Scheme made under section 48 of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended. The contribution shall be paid prior to the commencement of development or in such phased payments as the planning authority may facilitate and shall be subject to any applicable indexation provisions of the Scheme at the time of payment. Details of the application of the terms of the Scheme shall be agreed between the planning authority and the developer or, in default of such agreement, the matter shall be referred to An Bord Pleanála to determine the proper application of the terms of the Scheme.

Reason: It is a requirement of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, that a condition requiring a contribution in accordance with the Development Contribution Scheme made under section 48 of the Act be applied to the permission.
