

## Board Order ABP-306564-20

Planning and Development Acts 2000 to 2019

**Planning Authority: Cork County Council** 

Planning Register Reference Number: 19/05018

**APPEAL** by Michael and Marion O'Sullivan care of Gerald McCarthy of 72 Main Street, Macroom, County Cork against the decision made on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2020 by Cork County Council to refuse permission.

**Proposed Development:** Demolition of existing dwellinghouse and construction of two number detached dwellinghouses with individual on-site proprietary treatment units and polishing filters, new entrance, boundary walls together with all other ancillary site works, at Carrigadrohid Townland, Carrigadrohid, County Cork.

## **Decision**

REFUSE permission for the above proposed development in accordance with the reasons and considerations set out below.

## **Matters Considered**

In making its decision, the Board had regard to those matters to which, by virtue of the Planning and Development Acts and Regulations made thereunder, it was required to have regard. Such matters included any

submissions and observations received by it in accordance with statutory provisions.

## **Reasons and Considerations**

- Having regard to the steeply sloping nature of the terrain and the
  restricted area of the site, it is considered that the proposals for foul
  drainage, including a soil polishing filter, would be prejudicial to public
  health due to the risk of effluent seeping onto the adjacent properties.
  The proposed development would, therefore, be contrary to the proper
  planning and sustainable development of the area.
- 2. The proposed development would result in an excessive concentration of development served by wastewater treatment systems in an area which is considered to be a sensitive water environment within 300 metres of the River Lee. The Board is not satisfied that the effluent from the proposed development can be satisfactorily treated or disposed of on site, notwithstanding the proposed use of a sand polishing filter, nor that the proposed development would not result in an excessive concentration of development served by wastewater treatment systems in an area which is considered to be a sensitive water environment. The proposed development would, therefore, be contrary to the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.
