

Board Order ABP-307196-20

Planning and Development Acts 2000 to 2019

Planning Authority: South Dublin County Council

Planning Register Reference Number: \$25419/05

Appeal by Cignal Infrastructure Limited of Suite 311, Q House, 76 Furze Road, Sandyford Industrial Estate, Dublin against the decision made on the 3rd day of December, 2019 by South Dublin County Council to refuse a licence.

Application: Licence for the erection of a new 15 metres high monopole structure comprising a street pole and antenna, and associated cabinet at Grifeen Avenue, R136 Junction, Lucan, County Dublin.

Decision

In exercise of the powers conferred on it under section 254 of the Planning and Development Act, 2000, as amended, An Bord Pleanála, based on the reasons and considerations under, ALLOWS the appeal and directs the planning authority to GRANT a licence subject to the conditions set out below.

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Matters Considered

In making its decision, the Board had regard to those matters to which, by virtue of the Planning and Development Acts and Regulations made thereunder, it was required to have regard. Such matters included any submissions and observations received by it in accordance with statutory provisions.

Reasons and Considerations

Having regard to the provisions of section 254 of the Planning and Development Act, 2000, as amended, to relevant national and local policy, including Policy IE4 as set out in the South Dublin County Development Plan 2016-2022 and the "Telecommunications Antennae and Support Structures: Guidelines for Planning Authorities, issued by the Department of the Environment, Heritage and Local Government in 1996, as updated by Circular Letter PL 07/12 in 2012, it is considered that, subject to compliance with the conditions set out below, the proposed development would be consistent with the relevant provisions of the South Dublin County Development Plan 2016-2022, would not seriously injure the amenities of the area or residential amenity in the vicinity and would not interfere with the safety of road users including pedestrians. The proposed development would, therefore, be in accordance with the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.

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Conditions

1. The licence shall be valid for a period of three years from the date of

this Order. The telecommunications structure and related ancillary

structures including any access arrangements shall then be removed

and the site lands shall be reinstated on removal of the

telecommunications structure and ancillary structures unless, prior to

the end of the period, planning permission shall have been granted for

their retention for a further period.

Reason: To enable the impact of the development to be re-assessed,

having regard to changes in technology and design during the specified

period.

2. The antenna type and mounting configuration shall be in accordance

with the details submitted with this application for a licence, and

notwithstanding the provisions of the Planning and Development

Regulations 2001, and any statutory provision amending or replacing

them, shall not be altered without a prior grant of planning permission.

Reason: To clarify the nature and extent of the permitted development

to which this permission relates and to facilitate a full assessment of

any future alterations.

3. Surface water drainage arrangements for the proposed development

shall comply with the requirements of the planning authority.

Reason: In the interest of public health.

4. A low intensity fixed red obstacle light shall be fitted as close to the top of the mast as practicable and shall be visible from all angles in azimuth. Details of this light, its location and period of operation shall be submitted to, and agreed in writing with, the planning authority prior to commencement of development.

Reason: In the interest of public safety.

 Details of the proposed colour scheme for the pole, antennas, equipment containers and any perimeter fencing shall be submitted to, and agreed in writing with, the planning authority prior to commencement of development.

Reason: In the interest of the visual amenities of the area.

 Landscaping of the site shall be carried out in accordance with a landscaping scheme, details of which shall be submitted to, and agreed in writing with, the planning authority prior to commencement of development.

Reason: In the interest of the visual amenities of the area.

 No advertisement or advertisement structure shall be erected or displayed on the proposed structure or within the curtilage of the site without a prior grant of planning permission.

Reason: In the interest of the visual amenities of the area.
