

Board Order ABP-307513-20

Planning and Development Acts 2000 to 2020 Planning Authority: Wexford County Council Planning Register Reference Number: 20191146

APPEAL by Richard and Joan Carter of Hollyside, Coolboy Lane, Newbawn, County Wexford against the decision made on the 17th day of June, 2020 by Wexford County Council to grant subject to conditions a permission to Daniel Fenlon and Kerry Treanor care of John Roche of Saint Leonards, Ballycullane, New Ross, County Wexford.

Proposed Development: The erection of a fully serviced dwellinghouse and garage at Coolboy, Newbawn, County Wexford.

Decision

REFUSE permission for the above proposed development in accordance with the reasons and considerations set out below.

Matters Considered

In making its decision, the Board had regard to those matters to which, by virtue of the Planning and Development Acts and Regulations made thereunder, it was required to have regard. Such matters included any submissions and observations received by it in accordance with statutory provisions.

Reasons and Considerations

1. Having regard to the location of the site within a rural area which is under urban influence, and to National Policy Objective 19 of the National Planning Framework (February 2018), which, for rural areas under urban influence, seeks to 'facilitate the provision of single housing in the countryside based on the core consideration of demonstrable economic or social need to live in a rural area...having regard to the viability of smaller towns and rural settlements', it is considered that the applicant has not demonstrated an economic or social need to live in a rural area having regard to the viability of smaller towns and rural settlements and, therefore, the proposed development does not comply with National Policy Objective 19. The proposed development would contribute to the encroachment of random rural development in the area, would militate against the preservation of the rural environment and the efficient provision of public services and infrastructure, and would contravene the provisions of the National Planning Framework. The proposed development would, therefore, be contrary to the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.

2. Having regard to the location of the site within a "Stronger Rural Area" as identified in the Sustainable Rural Housing Guidelines for Planning Authorities issued by the Department of the Environment, Heritage and Local Government in April 2005 and in an area where housing is restricted to persons demonstrating local need in accordance with the current Wexford County Development Plan 2013 – 2019, as extended, it is considered that the applicants have not adequately demonstrated that they come within the scope of the housing need criteria as set out in the Guidelines and the Development Plan for a house at this location. The proposed development, in the absence of any identified locally based need for the house, would contribute to the encroachment of random rural development in the area and would militate against the preservation of the rural environment and the efficient provision of public services and infrastructure. The proposed development would, therefore, be contrary to the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.
