

Board Order ABP-310353-21

Derelict Sites Act, 1990

Planning and Development Acts, 2000 to 2020

Planning Authority: Limerick City and County Council

Application received by An Bord Pleanála on the 26th day of May, 2021 from Limerick City and County Council pursuant to section 16 of the Derelict Sites Act, 1990, as amended, for consent to the compulsory acquisition of a site at Convent Road, Abbeyfeale, County Limerick and as more particularly described in the notice of intention to compulsorily acquire the site.

Decision

REFUSE consent to the compulsory acquisition of the said site based on the reasons and considerations set out below.

Matters Considered

In making its decision, the Board had regard to those matters to which, by virtue of the Planning and Development Acts and Regulations made thereunder, it was required to have regard. Such matters included any submissions and observations received by it in accordance with statutory provisions.

Reasons and Considerations

Notwithstanding the current derelict and objectionable condition of the site, which detracts to a material degree from the amenity, character and appearance of land in the neighbourhood, taking into account the grant of planning permission on the 10th day of July, 2018 to (a) combine two cottages into one dwelling house, (b) demolish existing front porch and rear extensions, (c) construct a rear extension, (d) elevation changes and internal alterations and all associated site works under Planning Register Reference Number 18/524, together with the evidence of the ongoing efforts by the notice party to seek to address the issues of dereliction and to bring the property back into use, the Board decided that the acquisition of the site by the local authority is not necessary in order to render the site non-derelict and to prevent it continuing to be a derelict site, and that it would, therefore, be appropriate to refuse consent for the compulsory acquisition of the site.
