

Board Order ABP-311772-21

Planning and Development Acts, 2000 to 2022

Planning Authority: Leitrim County Council

Application by Leitrim County Council for approval under section 177AE of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, in accordance with plans and particulars, including a Natura Impact Statement, lodged with An Bord Pleanála on the 27th day of October, 2021 and the further information received on the 11th day of May, 2022.

Proposed Development: The proposed development comprises:

- 1. The demolition of the existing Hartley Bridge over the River Shannon.
- Construction of new three-span replacement bridge structure approximately 25
 metres downstream of the existing bridge crossing.
- 3. Construction of the realigned (vertical and horizontal) L3400 local road on approaches to the new bridge structure.
- 4. Decommissioning of defunct sections of the L3400 local road.
- 5. All ancillary works associated with the above works, including:
 - (a) temporary site compound,
 - (b) drainage and other utility works,
 - (c) road safety barriers, and
 - (d) fencing.

All at Hartley, Carrick on Shannon, County Leitrim and Cleaheen, County Roscommon.

Decision

APPROVE the above proposed development based on the reasons and considerations under and subject to the conditions set out below.

Reasons and Considerations

In coming to its decision, the Board had regard to the following:

- (a) the EU Habitats Directive (92/43/EEC) and Part XAB of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, including Part 177AE and 177V,
- (b) the European Union (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011, as amended,
- (c) the Climate Action Plan 2023,
- (d) the Water Framework Directive (2000/60/EC),
- (e) the likely consequences for the environment and the proper planning and sustainable development of the area in which it is proposed to carry out the proposed development and the likely significant effects of the proposed development on European Sites,
- (f) the conservation objectives and qualifying interests for the Lough Forbes Complex Special Area of Conservation (Site Code: 001818),
- (g) the policies and objectives of the Roscommon County Development Plan 2022
 2028 and the Leitrim County Development Plan 2023 2029,
- the nature and extent of the proposed works as set out in the application for approval,
- (i) the information submitted in relation to the potential impacts on habitats, flora and fauna, including the Natura Impact Statement,

- (j) the submissions and observations received in relation to the proposed development, and
- (k) the report and recommendation of the person appointed by the Board to make a report and recommendation on the matter.

Appropriate Assessment:

The Board agreed with and adopted the screening assessment and conclusion carried out in the Inspector's report that the Lough Forbes Complex Special Area of Conservation (Site Code: 001818) is the only European Site in respect of which the proposed development has the potential to have a significant effect.

The Board considered the Natura Impact Statement and associated documentation submitted with the application for approval, the mitigation measures contained therein, the response to the further information request received on the 11th day of May, 2022 the submissions and observations on file, and the Inspector's assessment. The Board carried out an appropriate assessment of the implications of the proposed development for the affected European Site, namely the Lough Forbes Complex Special Area of Conservation (Site Code: 001818), in view of the Site's conservation objectives. The Board considered that the information before it was adequate to allow the carrying out of an appropriate assessment. In completing the appropriate assessment, the Board considered, in particular, the following:

- i. The likely direct and indirect impacts arising from the proposed development both individually or in combination with other plans or projects,
- ii. The mitigation measures which are included as part of the proposed development,
- iii. The conservation objectives for the European Site.

In completing the appropriate assessment, the Board accepted and adopted the appropriate assessment carried out in the Inspector's report in respect of the potential effects of the proposed development on the integrity of the aforementioned European Site, having regard to the Site's conservation objectives.

In overall conclusion, the Board was satisfied that the proposed development, by itself or in combination with other plans or projects, would not adversely affect the integrity of the European Site, in view of the Site's conservation objectives.

Proper Planning and Sustainable Development/Likely effects on the environment:

It is considered that, subject to compliance with the conditions set out below, the proposed development would not have significant negative effects on the environment or the community in the vicinity, would not give rise to a risk of pollution, would not be detrimental to the visual or landscape amenities of the area, would not seriously injure the amenities of property in the vicinity, would not adversely impact on the cultural, archaeological and built heritage of the area and would not interfere with the existing land uses in the area. The proposed development would, therefore, be in accordance with the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.

CONDITIONS

 The proposed development shall be carried out and completed in accordance with the plans and particulars lodged with the application, as amended by the further plans and particulars received by An Bord Pleanála on the 11th day of May 2022, except as may otherwise be required in order to comply with the following conditions.

Reason: In the interest of clarity.

 All mitigation measures and environmental commitments identified in the Ecological Impact Assessment and the Natura Impact Statement shall be implemented in full as part of the proposed development.

Reason: In the interests of protecting the environment, the protection of European Sites and in the interest of public health.

- 3. Construction of the development shall comply with the following:
 - (a) No tree felling or vegetation removal shall take place during the period March to August (inclusive).
 - (b) In-stream works shall only take place between July and September (inclusive).

Reason: To prevent disturbance to breeding birds and aquatic species, respectively, and in the interest of nature conservation.

4. A suitably qualified ecologist shall be retained by the local authority to oversee the site set up and construction of the proposed development and implementation of mitigation measures relating to ecology set out in the Natura Impact Statement. The ecologist shall be present during site construction works and shall have the authority to stop works if required. Upon completion of works, an ecological report of the site works shall be prepared by the appointed ecologist to be kept on file as part of the public record.

Reason: In the interests of nature conservation and the protection of terrestrial and aquatic biodiversity.

5. Prior to the commencement of development, a pre-construction bird survey for breeding waders shall be undertaken by a suitably qualified and experienced bird specialist. The survey shall be kept on file as part of the public record and a copy shall be sent to the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage.

Reason: In the interest of nature conservation.

 All works shall have regard to Inland Fisheries Ireland's published guidelines for construction works near waterways (Guidelines on Protection of Fisheries during Construction Works in and Adjacent to Waters, 2016).

Reason: In the interest of the protecting of receiving water quality, fisheries and aquatic habitats.

7. The local authority and any agent acting on its behalf shall ensure that any imported materials to the site are thoroughly screened for the presence of invasive species prior to the delivery to the site to prevent the spread of invasive species. The local authority shall also ensure that all excavations carried out within the site are monitored for the presence of invasive species and if encountered disposed of in a manner which will not give rise to further spread of the species.

Reason: In the interest of the proper planning and sustainable development of the area and to ensure the protection of the European Site.

8. Swift boxes and bat boxes shall be installed on the new bridge and details of the boxes installed shall be kept on file as part of the public record.

Reason: To ensure the protection of the natural heritage on the site.

9. The local authority and any agent acting on its behalf shall facilitate the preservation, recording, protection or removal of archaeological materials or features that may exist within the site. A suitably qualified archaeologist shall be appointed by the local authority to oversee the site set-up and construction of the proposed development and the archaeologist shall be present on site during construction works. The extent of archaeological monitoring shall be as set out in the submitted Archaeological Impact Assessment.

Reason: In order to conserve the archaeological heritage of the site and to secure the preservation and protection of any remains that may exist within the site.

10. A full architectural survey of the existing Hartley Bridge, to include archive standard drawings and a photographic survey, shall be carried out prior to its demolition and shall be kept on file as part of the public record.

Reason: In order to facilitate the conservation, preservation and/or recording of the architectural heritage of the site.

11. The local authority shall ensure that access to the existing public right of way identified in Table 11.2 of the Roscommon County Development Plan 2022 - 2028 as 'access to fishing area at Hartley Bridge on the River Shannon' is preserved in accordance with Policy Objective SCCD 11.17 of the Development Plan.

Reason: In the interests of proper planning and sustainable development.
