

Board Order ABP-313324-22

Planning and Development Acts 2000 to 2022

Planning Authority: Dublin City Council

Appeal by Kevin Sweeney of 125 Howth Road, Clontarf, Dublin against the decision made on the 10th day of March, 2022 by Dublin City Council to grant, subject to conditions, a licence to On Tower Ireland Limited (a Cellnex Company) care of Jason Redmond and Associates, Consulting Engineers of 5 Lismard Court, Portlaoise, County Laois.

Licence Application: To place telecommunication infrastructure on the public footpath. This includes a 15 metre alpha 3.0 streetpole solution with antenna and ground equipment cabinet at Howth Road, Clontarf, Dublin.

Decision

In exercise of the powers conferred on it under section 254 of the Planning and Development Act, 2000, as amended, An Bord Pleanála, directs the planning authority to GRANT a licence, based on the reasons and considerations under and subject to the conditions set out below.

REASONS AND CONSIDERATIONS

Having regard to the provisions of section 254 of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, to national, regional and local policy objectives, as represented in the Dublin City Development Plan 2022-2028, to support the development of a sustainable telecommunications network throughout the city, to the Department of Environment, Heritage and Local Government section 28 Statutory Guidelines, "Telecommunications Antennae and Support Structures: Guidelines for Planning Authorities, 1996, as updated by circular letter PL 07/12 in 2012, and to the nature and scale of the development, it is considered that, subject to compliance with the conditions set out below, the proposed development would not seriously injure the residential or visual amenities of the area or of property in the vicinity, would not be prejudicial to public health and would be acceptable in terms of traffic safety and convenience. The proposed development would, therefore, be in accordance with the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.

Conditions

- 1. This licence is for one 15 metre freestanding pole and antennae and associated operator cabinet only in accordance with the details submitted to the planning authority on the 6th day of December, 2021.
 - **Reason:** To clarify the nature and extent of the permitted development to which this licence relates and to facilitate a full assessment of any future alterations.
- 2. (a) The licence shall be valid for a period of five years only from the date of this Order. The telecommunications structure and related ancillary structures shall then be removed unless, prior to the end of the period, a further Section 254 licence has been granted for their retention for a further period.



(b) The site shall be reinstated on removal of the telecommunications structure and ancillary structures. Details relating to the removal and reinstatement shall be submitted to, and agreed in writing with, the planning authority at least one month before the date of expiry of this licence.

Reason: To enable the impact and acceptability of the development to be reassessed, having regard to changes in technology and design during the specified period.

3. No advertisement or advertisement structure shall be erected or displayed on the proposed structure or within the curtilage of the site.

Reason: In the interest of the visual amenities of the area.

 The structures hereby permitted shall not interfere with existing services, existing drainage systems and shall not obstruct pedestrian access.

Reason: In the interests of orderly development and pedestrian safety.
