

Board Order ABP-317461-23

Planning and Development Acts 2000 to 2022

WHEREAS N. Noone of Flat 1, 53 Grove Park, Dublin appealed against the decision made on the 2nd day of June, 2023 by Roscommon County Council to grant subject to conditions a permission to Hanley Quarries Limited care of A.S.E. Design Consultants Limited of Drumullin, Elphin, County Roscommon for development comprising the installation and operation of an asphalt plant and all associated plant and infrastructure including operator control cabin (16.25 square metres) and ancillary works on a circa 1.6 hectare application site within the existing quarry in the townlands of Cuilreevagh and Largan, Elphin, County Roscommon in accordance with plans and particulars lodged with the said Council:

AND WHEREAS the Board is of opinion that proof of address and proof of identity of the 3rd party appellant is necessary for the purpose of enabling it to determine the appeal:

AND WHEREAS the Board, on the 8th day of March, 2023 (Registered Post) and the 20th day of March, 2024 (Regular Post), served notice on the 3rd party appellant, requiring them to submit on or before the 28th day of March, 2024 (Register and Regular Post), the above-mentioned particulars and informing them that, in default of compliance with the requirements of the said notice,



the Board would, after the expiration of the specified period and without further notice to them, dismiss or otherwise determine the appeal:

AND WHEREAS the said particulars were not received by the Board within the period specified in the said notice served under section 132 of the Planning and Development Act, 2000:

NOW THEREFORE, An Bord Pleanála, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 133 of the Planning and Development Act, 2000, and based on the reasons and considerations set out below, hereby dismisses the said appeal.

Reasons and Considerations

On the basis of the information on file, and the lack of response to the Board's request for further information issued under Section 132 of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, seeking proof of address and proof of identity and which statutory request was sent, both by registered post (8th March 2024) and regular post (20th March 2024), and on the basis that the period for response specified in the notice has expired, the Board decided to dismiss the appeal, due to the lack of information within the appeal documentation as to the identity of the appellant and the address of the appellant.
