**Commission Order
PL-501114-LK-26**

Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended

Planning Authority: Limerick City and County Council

Planning Register Reference Number: 26/60069

Appeal by Tom Ryan against the decision made on the 18th day of March 2026, by Limerick City and County Council to grant, subject to conditions, a permission to Analog Devices International Unlimited Company in accordance with plans and particulars lodged with the said Council.

Proposed Development: The construction of a new high purity liquid nitrogen (HPN) facility, including two number 24.4 metre high storage tanks, one number 17.4 metre high vacuum tank, two number 11.6 metre high vaporizer tanks and two number 6.7 metre high absorber vessel tanks, together with associated plant and equipment, including a 4.934 metre high electrical switchroom building, alterations to existing equipment, and all associated services, drainage and site works on site of circa 1,333 square metres located adjacent to the existing high purity liquid nitrogen (HPN) facility off Ballynoe Road (private road) within the existing Analog Devices Campus.

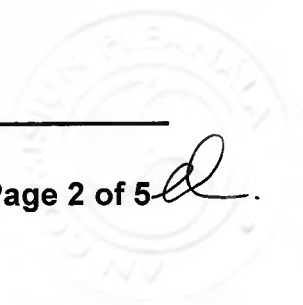
This is an existing Lower Tier Seveso site, and the development consists of modifications to an establishment within the meaning of the European Communities Chemicals Act (Control of Major Accident Hazards Involving Dangerous Substances) Regulations. The site operates under an Integrated Pollution Control (IPC) licence, all located at Analog Devices B.V Limited, Ballynoe Road, Cloughkeating Avenue, Raheen Business Park, Ballycummin, County Limerick.

Decision

GRANT permission for the above proposed development in accordance with the said plans and particulars based on the reasons and considerations under and subject to the conditions set out below.

Reasons and Considerations

Having regard to the planning history and the zoning objective of the subject site, to its location within the existing Raheen Business Park and to the nature and scale of the proposed development within an existing industrial area, the Commission considered that, subject to compliance with the conditions set out below, the proposed development would be acceptable, would not have a significant impact on surface water discharge from the subject site and that no foul water would enter the surface water system and would not seriously injure the amenities of the area. The proposed development would, therefore, be in accordance with the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.



Conditions

1. The development shall be carried out and completed in accordance with the plans and particulars lodged with the application, except as may otherwise be required in order to comply with the following conditions. Where such conditions require details to be agreed with the planning authority, the developer shall agree such details in writing with the planning authority prior to commencement of development and the development shall be carried out and completed in accordance with the agreed particulars.

Reason: In the interest of clarity.

2. Drainage arrangements, including the attenuation and disposal of surface water, shall comply with the requirements of the planning authority for such works and services.

Reason: In the interests of public health and surface water management.

3. Site development and building works shall be carried out between the hours of 0700 and 1900 from Mondays to Fridays inclusive, between 0800 and 1400 hours on Saturdays and not at all on Sundays and public holidays. Deviation from these times shall only be allowed in exceptional circumstances where prior written agreement has been received from the planning authority.

Reason: To safeguard the amenity of property in the vicinity.

4. A Construction and Environmental Management Plan (CEMP) shall be submitted to, and agreed in writing with, the planning authority prior to the commencement of development. The CEMP shall include, but not be limited to, construction phase controls for dust, noise and vibration, waste management, protection of soils, groundwaters, and surface waters, site housekeeping, emergency response planning, site environmental policy, and project roles and responsibilities.

Reason: In the interests of environmental protection, public health and safety and environmental protection.

5. Prior to the commencement of development, the developer or any agent acting on its behalf, shall prepare a Resource Waste Management Plan (RWMP) as set out in the Environmental Protection Agency's Best Practice Guidelines for the Preparation of Resource and Waste Management Plans for Construction and Demolition Projects (2021) including demonstration of proposals to adhere to best practice and protocols. The RWMP shall include specific proposals as to how the RWMP will be measured and monitored for effectiveness; these details shall be placed on the file and retained as part of the public record. The RWMP must be submitted to the planning authority for written agreement prior to the commencement of development. All records (including for waste and all resources) pursuant to the agreed RWMP shall be made available for inspection at the site office at all times.

Reason: In the interest of proper planning and sustainable development.
