

Introduction

The Board referred to its previous meeting with the prospective applicant of the 30th June, 2021 and the record of this meeting. The Board asked if the prospective applicants had any comments it wished to make on the record of this meeting; the prospective applicant replied that it had no comments to make.

Presentation by the Prospective Applicant

The prospective applicant gave a brief introduction to the project team and an overview of the matters to be discussed during the meeting.

The prospective applicant recapped on the proposed development which is to develop a 110kV substation within the site of the consented Dennistown Solar Farm which is located approximately 800m south-east of Murntown village, 800m south-west of Piercetown village and 6.5 km from Wexford Town. It currently has consent for a solar farm development with an on-site substation (38kV). The prospective applicant outlined the need for the development and highlighted that ESB currently have five solar farm projects in South Wexford with consent but no consent in place for grid connections. It is intended that these five projects would connect into the proposed Dennistown Substation and then connect into the national electricity grid at Wexford substation.

The prospective applicant stated that the proposed Dennistown 110kV substation would be designed to function as a "collection hub" for electricity generated in these solar energy developments in the area for its onward transmission to the national grid at Wexford substation. The current consent of a 38 kV substation needs to be amended to accommodate the proposed 110kV structure. It is anticipated that the proposed 110kV substation would remain generally in the same location as the permitted 38kV substation.

In response to the Board's representatives preliminary view that the proposal is strategic infrastructure development (notwithstanding that the decision rests with the Board), the prospective applicant accepted this and confirmed the substation is a node to facilitate future transmission from the solar projects in the area to the national electricity grid. The prospective applicant said it is important to note that the future intentions of Eirgrid are unknown and it is not unusual for lands to be identified

for future expansion as a contingency plan. Usually, these lands would be identified and sterilised from development for the future.

The prospective applicant also noted the precedent case previously mentioned (ABP- 308120-20 in Rhode, Co. Offaly) which comprised a looped-in connection. The proposed Dennistown development is a tail-fed project.

The prospective applicant provided an overview in relation to EIA screening. It highlighted the fact that a substation is not an EIA Development under Schedule 5, Part I & Part II, however for robustness, a screening assessment including submission of Schedule 7A information would be undertaken as part of any subsequent application. The prospective applicant stated that each grid route for solar farms connecting at Dennistown would have individual EIA screening once the route is known, with all known interactions assessed. The prospective applicant made reference to the Ratheniska High Court Judgement in relation to future developments and assessing the unknown.

Discussion

- With regard to the five individual solar farms to be connected at Dennistown,
 the Board's representatives noted that this would emphasise the strategic
 nature of the proposed development and reinforces the preliminary view
 expressed at the first meeting. The prospective applicant accepted that the
 project could be interpretated as falling within the remit of section 182A of the
 Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended.
- The Board's representatives agreed with the prospective applicant's approach to include EIA Screening including Schedule 7A information as part of any subsequent application.
- In response to a query on the matter, the prospective applicant stated that discussions were had with Eirgrid in relation to the five individual solar projects and the potential for another project in the locality to connect into the substation at Dennistown. However, in terms of using the future expansion area, this has not been discussed. The prospective applicant stated that the

- reservation of an area for future expansion is a standard requirement for Eirgrid for a development of this nature.
- The Board's representatives queried whether any part of the proposed development would be contestable. The prospective applicant said there would be a contestable element to this project and these areas would be clearly highlighted in any subsequent application.
- The prospective applicant stated that the original development at Dennistown
 was screened out for Appropriate Assessment but that this matter will be revisited in the context of the proposed development.
- The Board's representatives agreed that any proposed application would supersede the permission for the 38kV substation. The prospective applicant made reference to a similar application currently with the Board under reference ABP-310141-21 in Shantallow, Co. Galway.

Conclusion

The record of the instant meeting will issue. The prospective applicant can then respond with their own comments on issues raised in the record. It is not anticipated that further meetings will be required, however this is a matter for the prospective applicant to decide. It is up to the prospective applicant to notify the Board if they require additional meetings or if they wish to conclude the pre-application consultation process.
