

We already have made an extensive submission to FCC and ANCA regarding the DAA application (ref F20 A/066) to change ABP planning conditions set down in 2007 for the operation of the new parallel runway

Changes to Planning Conditions (3D) and 5 pertained to night time flights on the new runway. We are strongly opposed to changes as it would have very serious consequences on the health and wellbeing of communities around the airport during their hours of sleep. Night time hours should still be from 11.00AM to 7.00AM and not from 12.00AM to 6.00AM

The world health organisation (WHO) have very clearly pointed out the effects on people's health of noise levels exceeding 40db especially at night. Aircraft noise is considered to be the worst form of noise.

There are several studies showing the effects on people's health of aircraft noise during their hours of sleep. These include the following:

Hypertension

Stroke

Arrhythmias

Sleep disruption

Physiological stress reaction

The sleep disturbance for school going children and children with special needs e.g. autism was not considered by ANCA. Neither was the noise impact on the health of the elderly given due consideration. There are now thousands in this category living in Portmarnock, Swords , Malahide

and other areas. Many bought their houses in these areas in the early seventies and nearly all these houses were badly insulated against aircraft noise. The Planning Conditions for our houses in Martello had to comply with the Planning and Development ACT 1963

- 1 The windows must be double glazed with a pitch of 6 inches and each pane of glass must be of thirty two ounce weight type.
 - 2 ALL external doors to the house shall be a minimum of two inches solid wood and
 - 3 Acoustic board sheets with a thickness of 2 inches shall be fitted to the top of the ceiling joists with full joining effected at such points as eaves, party walls, chimney breasts and water tank supports leaving no uninsulated gaps at these points or alternatively shall be fitted to the rafters with full joining effected at points connected to the eaves.

These conditions were set down so that (quote)

In the interests of the amenities of the houses and the health of the occupants having regard to the location of the site in an area where aircraft noise is likely to be a significant factor 9end of quote)

Only one of these conditions was adhered too by the developers. That was the one pertaining to the windows which have subsequently been replaced because of the inferior wood used in them.

The DAA have committed themselves to insulating houses with noise levels exceeding 55db. The insulation scheme should have been extended to thousands of more houses before the DAA was allowed to operate the runway especially during night hours

The necessity for early morning flights was not addressed by ANCA. Several of these flights are going to travel destinations and only a minimum for business purposes. Indeed the pandemic showed how it possible for a lot of international business to be conducted by Zoom, webinars and other such means...

The DAA has certainly put the economic needs of the country way ahead of the health of communities living near the airport. It could be argued that the consequences for the health budget will be far greater than the economic benefits to the country occurring from new north runway

The DAA will use the new runway as a major international hub and connectivity point for aircraft crossing the world. These aircraft will be mostly at night and will not bring any great benefits to the economy. Why couldn't Shannon Airport be used for such flights since it has a runway well capable of taking them and is eagerly looking for more business?

The Balanced Approach set out under EU Regulation 598/14 will certainly not be balanced as it is undoubtedly weighted by ANCA in favour of the DAA. We will now be living in chronic noise corridor as the southern runway will continue to operate at the same time as the new one.

Finally the DAA and ANCA consultation with communities was very poor as no public meetings took place during Coved 19. The webinar meetings conducted by ANCA were a farce as the cross examination of the speakers could not be take place. The panel just answered presubmitted questions and didn't allow for cross examination by the public.

It also brought home to us that ANCA is not an independent noise monitoring body envisaged under the EU directive 598/14 as it is too closely connected to FCC who are the largest ratepayers to the Dublin Airport

Our only hope now is that ABP will stick to their original planning conditions of 2007 and not allow DAA ignore the wishes of airport communities
