I am very concerned about the possibility of increasing night flights. I already struggle to get to sleep before 12 midnight due to late flights arriving over my house in Portmarnock. I wake shortly after 6 when the early morning flights start. If there is no effective limit in place, late flights will get later and the morning flights will be coming thick and fast.

I can't sleep with my windows open, Summer or Winter or the noise of every flight will wake me, so I stifle with the heat in Summertime, as noise insulation is completely ineffective.

As a local GP I am aware of many patients who are affected by nighttime flights which severely impact their sleep and therefore mental health. There is an epidemic of mental health issues locally due to this and people living outside this area have no idea what it's like.

Children affected by this present with learning difficulties in school as they cannot get enough sleep to allow their brains to function properly. This is aggravated by the harmful chemicals in the fumes from nearby aircraft which also adversely affect children and adults with respiratory and heart health issues. Please, please do not let DAA have their way with more night flights. Please follow the examples of other large international airports which ban night flights entirely, or limit them to a handful of the quietest aircraft only. The health of local people is at stake.
