Amending aircraft operating restrictions for Dublin Airport when the new runway opens can only result in very much additional aircraft night-time noise in the areas close to the airport.

The Director of ANCA, states that the "decisions we make together will affect local residents ....."

Very many local residents are extremely worried about any amending of the restrictions and plead with ANCA not to change them. The greatest fear is of excessive night-time noise from planes arriving and departing at the airport during the night, particularly from new angles to or from the new runway.

Local residents recognise the importance of the airport and the DAA to the region. But they would also like recognition and respect by the DAA to the importance of those residents being able to live in their homes without enduring excessive and disruptive noise during night-time hours.

Surely the residents, of all ages, are entitled to have their wishes allowed in relation to night-time noise. The homes of the residents represent the biggest investments they will make in their lives and should not be interfered with by a new development. Any easing of the restrictions will have a very detrimental affect on the night-time lives of local residents in their own homes.
