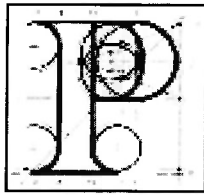

This appeal is just another example of the dysfunctional organisation that is DAA. On a number of occasions where I have been at meetings with DAA (e.g. Grand Malahide, I have been told that the brief/mission statement of the DAA is "to grow". The appeal by DAA, demonstrates this approach by the organisation and its main mission is to grow with no regard to the implications of this growth

DAA got planning permission for the North Runway a number of years back despite huge objections from the local communities in regards to noise and pollution both to air and water. Despite getting planning permission on the very terms that the DAA sought, they now want to expand the terms of the permission. This further shows the organisation's approach to gaining unfettered growth. If this appeal is successful, they will most likely try to further denude any of the safeguards that the communities have – (men, women, children) with further appeals.

It is now known that the DAA are planning to turn Dublin Airport into a major hub. This will lead to increased noise, pollution, traffic and other inconvenience to local residents with little or no benefit for Dublin itself. This approach is based on a fundamental greed and drive to grow for, no other reason than to grow. It demonstrates an organisation which whilst it is supposed to provide a public service, has turned itself into an immoral monolith, that is driven by a headless management structure.'
