Thank you for affording me another opportunity to respond to the recent submissions related to the above case.

Given that Dublin Airport is surround by residential dwellings, the airport should be closed at night time. There should be no night time flights and noisier aircraft should be prohibited.

The trend for European airports that are located in residential areas is to shutter operations at night time. These countries economies remain successful despite imposing flight volume restrictions, contrary to the assertion of economic doom submitted by the DAA. Night time flights amount to unreasonable interference for anyone in the community trying to sleep and poses a nuisance at night and in the early morning when a quiet environment is at a premium.

On reviewing the noise conture submissions of the DAA retained experts, they are clearly both just guessing!! They are guessing the impact of flights on my sleep, drawing contour lines, in conjecture, on a map, musing in their offices: "...maybe its this line?". Extending the lines to broaden the house insulation catchment is useless to me, standing in my kitchen at 02.00am awoken by sequences of roaring jets flying over my house.

Please do not remove or weaken the condition imposed on the original 2007 grant of planning permission. The condition protects the residential amenity of the whole community near the airport.
