Dear Sirs,

I refer to the response from Tom Philips and Associates dated 14th September 2023 on behalf of Dublin Airport Authority plc, their covering letter, relevant documents and maps pertaining to aircraft activity at Dublin Aerodrome.

My primary concern are my lands and residential home being subjected to excessive aircraft noise and air pollution. The new northern runway 28R/10L is primarily but not exclusively causing me great concern and I am fast approaching a complete disillusionment of the systems upholding planning laws in this country.

I am totally shocked to see the extension of noise contours but somewhat relieved to have my concerns validated as I have known from since its inception date in August 2022 that the new north runway was operating outside of its planning conditions granted in 2007. I have spoken to several neighbours who are in disbelief with the situation. None of my immediate neighbours being in the County of Meath were made aware via newspaper or site notice or any alternative method the impact of flight paths over their homes and lands. People are simply flabbergasted and are not prepared to accept the current status quo.

I support SMTW (St. Margaret The Ward Residents Group) and FORUM (Fingal Organised Residents Union Movement) observations that they will submit in response to this significant additional information. I thoroughly consider the matter unacceptable and unjust and damaging to mental well-being in the communities. The entire application must be refused immediately.

I have no interest in the proposed noise insulation mitigation scheme as I recognise it as a ruse to disguise the negative impact of the current flight paths and it will not serve to dissuade me in any manner at all to the hugely negative health consequences arising from this debacle.

We have been advised by community groups there is and has never been any reason since the opening of the new north runway to subject communities who had no preannounced health warnings to current flight paths, flight paths that are clearly leaving environmental noise contours that were absolutely stipulated in conditions attached to 2007 planning.

I am relying on the decision of An Bord Pleanála to protect my children's health and future wellbeing. Please do not hesitate to refuse this application.
