The Board cannot allow the current situation to continue without highlighting the grave injustice being inflicted on the students and staff of our school.

The Board of Management are shocked to see that the noise contours have extended hugely into our community and that Kilcoskan National School is now included within the noise eligibility contours. We note that there was no notice of this fact in any of the planning notices for this application to date.

Our school has grown and prospered greatly over the past number of years and now has over 100 students in its care. This has resulted in a wonderful and happy environment for our children and staff. In addition to four classes, Junior Infants through Sixth Class, the school also has two Autistic Spectrum Disorder Special Classes. This makes Kilcoskan NS one of the most highly noise sensitive pieces of community infrastructure in the county.

One of the common symptoms of autism is hypersensitivity to sensory input including sound. Until August 2022, children from the Autism classes could use the outdoor area without the significant impact of noise. Since the decision of the DAA to divert flights directly over the school, this is no longer possible. No mitigation measures that involve ventilation systems or insulation of the school building can adequately address this.


