

Further to your correspondence to us on the above case we wish to make the following observations/submissions:

I am annoyed to see that the noise contours have extended hugely into our community which was not part of the original planning.

I am just over a kilometre from the end of the new north runway, and I am now under the flight path. No one from the DAA has contacted me to do noise monitoring at my house!

I have had my doors & windows insulated based on the original planning permitted flight path, and to be honest its not sufficient due to holes for ventilation being drilled through my walls and the attic not being insulated.

I feel that I know fall under the buy out scheme that other families availed of who were under the original flight path. I have been told by the DAA that the buy out scheme is closing soon and its being looked at.

I fear for the health, safety and wellbeing of myself and my young family if the issues are not addressed and a positive conclusion is met.

St Margarets The Ward residents carried out noise monitoring on the north runway flight path and found the noise levels to be far beyond those predicted and rolled out by DAA during our consultations.

Their noise predictions are not accurate and unfounded, and they are trying to obtain permission by manipulating numbers. Why can they not submit actual noise results along the flight path which has been in operation since August 2022. The community could!

Using a phone noise monitor I can see that external at the front of my house the DB readings are 95 to 105 during take-off.

Internal the DB readings are between 55 & 65 during take-off.

Measurements of noise in bedrooms of housing already insulated indicate that the noise levels exceed the recommendation in Fingal Development Plan are not sufficient to protect human health.

There are references made to the noise zones on Fingal development plan. These noise zones must now be revised due to the proposed flight path over our area. Fingal County Council consider that there should be no residential development allowed in noise zone A as it is considered harmful to health or otherwise considered unacceptable due to the high levels of aircraft noise. However, the

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fight path now being operated by DAA is putting many existing residences in Noise Zone A and B which is just not acceptable from a health point of view.

In summary planning is an afterthought for DAA. Their actions show that they do not respect planning legislation or decisions of An Bord Pleanála.

This application must be refused.
