Observation relating to Bord Pleanala Case reference ABP- 314484-22 subsequent to the receipt of additional information from DAA.

To whom it concerns,

Looking at the information supplied by the DAA regarding night time use of the runway system at Dublin Airport, it is with great shock that we see the noise contours for night time flights have extended hugely right over the community of Ratoath without any discussion or information to the 11,000 residents who live there. There has been no notice of this fact in any of the planning notices for this application to date.

The DAA already breach planning permission very frequently by flying straight over Ratoath before 6am (attachment 1, 2) and right through the day (attachment 3). This was never in the planning permission granted in 2007 and yet the DAA ignore it.

Neither was permission granted in the EIA document from the DAA 18/12 /2020 slide 6 of 32 re actual night noise contours showing Ratoath **not** in their noise contours but they continue to disregard planning permission rules again.

The vibrational noise from these planes at this hour is very disruptive. There is complete disregard for the surrounding communities. The importance of a good night's sleep has been well documented for the physical and psychological health of our children and families.

My observation is to please do not allow the nighttime flights to increase over 65 or change the time to 11.30pm to 6am as they are blatantly breaking planning permission on all fronts already. Please enforce the granted planning permission from 2007.

There is zero respect for the planning laws or for people living in Ratoath, Ashbourne and surrounding communities. The DAA are not cooperating with the communities. As well documented by a lot of local pilots there are numerous options where the flight paths are not flying directly over heavily populated communities. The DAA refuse to engage. For a semi state company who are supposed to respect regulations, please ensure this happens. The actions of the DAA are not respecting planning legislation or decisions of An Bord Pleanala. This application must be refused. The Bord of the DAA must be held accountable for breaking planning legislation.




Figure 1 The present EIAR claims the coloured area as the "permitted" scenario.
