Further to your correspondence on the above case I wish to make the following observation/submission;

I was shocked to see that the noise contours have been extended hugely into our community and that a very significant number of dwellings are now to be included within the noise eligibility contours. I note that there was no notice of this fact in any of the planning notices for this planning application to date. Neighbours were only made aware of these changes at a public meeting where the changes were explained to us. None of the newspapers or site notices informed the public of these changes.

An Bord Pleanala did not give a public notice of this significant additional information. This is totally unacceptable and unjust to our community. Why do DAA (a semi state body) think they can slip the new contours without any consultation and expect no opposition. Who do they think they are they don't have to abide to the rules which the rest us have to. RTE comes to mind think they can do what they want and get away with it.

I note that in correspondence from Philips & Associates refer to the ANCA Regulatory decision regarding eligibility to noise insulation scheme and suggest that the change in the contours is as a result of their assessing that the increased area as a result is as a result of them considering this new area which contains dwellings to having a very significant effects.

I note that the DAA have never carried out significant tests criteria within any of the EIAR that they have submitted and therefore they have not met with the EIA directive. This is a fundamental flaw in the assessment as the EIA directive is clear, all significant impact on the environment must be identified, quantified and mitigation proposed. This has not happened to date. For areas under the north runway this involves comparing the scenario with no flights from north runway to a scenario where there will be night time flights. This has not been done.

Why have the noise contours grown. St Margaret's The Ward residents carried out noise monitoring on the north runway flight paths and found the noise levels far beyond those predicted by DAA. Their noise predictions are not accurate and are unfounded. They are trying to obtain permission by manipulating their numbers. Reference is made to the noise zones on **Fingal Development Plan**, these noise zones must now be revised due to the proposed flight paths over our area. Fingal Co. The flight paths now being operated by DAA is putting many existing residents in Noise zone A and B which is not acceptable from a health point of view.

Measurement of noise in bedrooms of housing already insulated indicate that the noise levels exceed the recommendations in the Fingal Development Plan are not sufficient to protect human health.

In summary this planning is an afterthought by the DAA. Their actions show that they do not respect planning legislation of the decisions of An Bord Pleanalta.

I would like my observation to be linked with the St Margaret's and The Ward Residents submission.

This application must be refused.
