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## Planning Observation re Dublin Airport Authority plans for Night Time Flights

I have lived in Portmarnock since 1979 and have had to endure increased aircraft noise levels due to

- the opening of the south runway
- · the opening of the north runway and
- the increase in aircraft traffic.

During the day time it is a nuisance but the night time is a completely different scenario as getting a proper night's sleep is very difficult due to aircraft noise levels.

While I have upgraded windows to help reduce but not eliminate the noise impact, leaving them closed particularly in warm weather is not an option. This leads to very broken sleep patterns, difficulty getting to sleep and waking early in the morning particularly if the aircraft are taking off in an easterly direction.

The opening of the north runway, even though it has not been used as much as the south runway has made the situation a lot worse due to my location.

I am not opposed to progress but like many city airports in the world there should be severe restrictions on night time operations at Dublin Airport(11pm to 7am). The plan to increase airport capacity to 40M plus will further add to the problem.

The public web portal-WEBTRAK currently has no noise monitor for the north runway approach over Portmarnock (Portmarnock Resort and Jameson Golf Links). The nearest is the Malahide road for the north runway and the Baldoyle coast road for the south runway. The web site is also approx. one hour behind real time. This makes it difficult to establish what aircraft are making the noise and the impact of this noise under the north runway flight path.

My position is that no extension to the day hours should be considered until a lot more noise data is available from the use of both runways and that the current number of night time flights should be reduced.
