

As one of the people who is now living between the two runways of at Dublin airport since the opening of the North Runway. The flight paths in 2007 planning permission are much different to the ones which are in use today. We are now been exposed to major health risks, due to the excessive noise and fumes. My understanding is that when you get planning permission and there are conditions attached to that planning you have to obey them to the letter of the law, so why can a semi state company like DAA allowed to ignore these conditions and get away with it. Then write to the Taoiseach Leo Varadkar, looking for him to sort it out in a favourably on their behalf.

In the additional information which was requested why has the DAA now put in for new flight paths if they are flying the correct flight paths to meet their planning conditions???

Please watch the DAA in front of the transport committee where they claimed they only realised there was a problem with the flight paths after the runway opened, they would fix them. Next it was IAA who said "every dog in the street who was involved with aviation knew where the flight paths were going" then have a look at Alan Farrell face???? As he realised he hadn't been told the whole story by DAA.

The so called "permitted" noise zones in this submission do not match the environmental impact statement for the granted permission.

My enjoyment of my home and garden has been severely impacted since the opening of the north runway. I can't have a conversation with the noise of the planes.

My sleep has been effected, also and I have concerns for the sleep of my grandchildren for sleep over's. For me the prospect of granting further changes to increase the day time hours and the night time flights is senseless when I am already suffering with major noise and sleepless nights.

I am one of the few houses whom was never offered any form of insulation, not that I think it will solve the issue going forward, I like to open a window to allow fresh air in, all be it polluted aviation air, therefore any insulation is useless.

The DAA say they are in regular contact with all stakeholders but when was the last time they attended any public meeting organised by residents and listened to residents' concerns????

I feel night flights should be banned as they are in other major airports in Europe. DAA have consistently broken the 65 flights a night by having double plus flights

most nights, since the opening of North runway, when their planning conditions should have been observed.

I feel we need to have an oral hearing owing to the serious of the situation and to allow local people have their say.
