I am one of over 30,000 people who are now living under an illegal flight path since the opening of the new North Runway. The 2007 planning condition documentation includes flight path assumptions which many people have built their lives around. The flight paths in the 2007 planning permission are much different to the ones in use today and since the new runway opened.

The noise from the current flightpaths is intolerable. These flight paths must be changed back to what was proposed in 2007. No further changes can be considered until this cricial issue is addressed first. There is a major health risk to tens of thousands of people due to excessive aircraft noise.

The effects on the environment are monumental and Ireland is one of the worst countries in the world in terms of GHG emissions. Increasing aircraft activity in the midst of a climate crisis seems counterintuitive so is there a solution to all of this, ie: the flight path + the possible expansion of the airport + the permitted passenger numbers? Why not look at Ireland as a whole – if air traffic needs to increase why not increase the size of Cork or Shannon airports or build another airport somewhere else? During the summer months the roads in and out of the airport are practically impassable making it very stressful for people to travel.

An oral hearing is absolutely necessary given the gravity of the situation.
