Please REFUSE PERMISSION to DAA Relevant Action because:

When DAA justify their actions as being for the benefit of the country business, they fail to remember the reason international business comes here is because of the stable and fair platform we operate within. This should not be a state where certain operatives can 'bully' there way around to get what they want. They have not adhered to the flight path rules and time restrictions set for them. It's not fair that if I breached my planning permission I would be punished, but it seems to be a different rule for big business.

We live in River Vally Swords and every morning my children have the strong smell of aviation fuel on their way into school, it stings the back of their throats. We live 1.4 km from the nearest runway. What other rules are being broken? We must enforce the one's we know about and not get emotional about this, if you break a rule to fix it and pay the consequences, not lobby your political friends to intervene with extensions.

Sunday morning sleep ins are a thing of the past because they usually start take off's around 7am, we'll have to bear this as it's what you'd expect from an airport, but if take offs happen during the night, it will be impossible to sleep. Summertime will be worse as most houses in our neighborhood are designed with opening windows for fresh air, but this will mean the noise will come in also. So we'll be sleep deprived.

When Kenny Jacobs was interviewed by Miriam O'Callaghan on Primetime, he said he understood the noise and he compared it to the container ships he heard where he lives in Clontarf. These boats create nothing like the noise and pollution of a container ship, so he really doesn't understand or is motivated to care for his local community. DAA are about business and will operate with the framework set out for them, but if no-one provides strict and fair rules, they will make the airport to uncomfortable and health damaging to live with as our neighbor. They have a second runway now and still they want more.

I have 4 children, 3 under the age of 18, The American CDC says 13-18 children need 8-10 hours so the current flight restriction of 11pm to 7am is the minimum. I'm no good without my 8 hours, so it will affect my productivity at work.

The DAA want to use an average noise measurement, but this doesn't make sense as it the peak noise that wake you up, not a constant din.

We need to protect our health and the health of our children. It's more important than DAA profit and we must remember they are only a transport system, a utility for people and thus should be managed by the people. It's not their place to determine what's good for the Irish economy, they are not qualified, unlike Bord Pleanala.
