

The flightpaths in the 2007 planning permission are totally different from the ones in use today, as a result we are now living under an illegal flightpath. Our enjoyment of our home and garden has been severely impacted since the opening of the North Runway, with the intermittent screaming of jet engines, one can't hear the radio or TV without having to raise the volume from the normal 14 to 65 in the case of the TV or having the shout while in the garden. The 2007 flightpaths show planes taking off and landing straight in line with the runway, none of this hard right hand turning as soon as they are airborne. The altitude at which the air traffic passes over our house is often less than 2000ft, we have been told by a commercial pilot that they can get a whole lot higher a whole lot quicker, the noise is too great at these low altitudes. If the planes flew straight as per 2007 planning permission then they would not be flying over our house and we would have no issues. It feels that the airport wants to be like the boy racers with their noisy cars, letting the community know that this is their patch, flying low and noisily over our beautiful countryside and that since they are so important for Ireland's economy our rights come second. There are other airports in Ireland and I am sure they would appreciate a slice of the cake "decentralisation".

World Health Organisations report "Environmental Noise Guidelines for the European Region" states clearly "that noise levels projected by the DAA is associated with adverse health effects".

An oral hearing is absolutely necessary given the gravity of the situation.
