

## Observation details

I work in rural areas of Fingal on a daily basis (places like Ballyboughal, Oldtown and Naul) and in each of these locations I am disturbed by the significant noise levels coming from overflying aircraft. Through my work, I have met hundreds of residents and neighbours in these villages, who have said that their health and happiness have been negatively impacted and they are suffering as a direct consequence of unrelenting aircraft noise.

My observation can be split into three parts, summarised below:

- 1. What I and other people I've met have already experienced.
- 2. What I and other people I've met fear for the future.
- 3. What should happen to address peoples concerns.
- 1. What I and other people I've met have already experienced.

The noise from the frequent night flights and the current flight paths during the day is intolerable. I and others in the area are mentally exhausted by the unrelenting noise coming from these aircraft. There are also signs that people are experiencing physical ailments because of this aircraft noise, which never ceases. There is also clear evidence to demonstrate that such noise, experienced by residents consistently (even at low levels), can lead to the onset of serious and chronic medical conditions (cardiovascular, skin conditions, mental health conditions; all brought about as a result of ongoing stress caused by noise from these illegal flights). I have heard anecdotally, from working with people in these villages, that many people have gone to their doctor describing sleep disturbances that now require medication, worrying symptoms of high blood pressure and feeling anxious and at times depressed because of how helpless they feel with the situation that they're in.

2. What I and other people I've met fear for the future.

While people have told me what has happened to them so far, they are equally worried for the future and what will happen if their health problems (caused by flight noise) persist into the future. Several people have told me they are considering moving from the area as they cannot countenance living with this excessive noise pollution in the long term. While everyone I've met acknowledges that they were aware – when moving to the area – that the airport was in relatively close proximity, nobody accepts that they should have to endure severe sleep disturbance and health consequences because of the current flight paths being used (which are in contravention of the 2007 planning conditions). In short, there has been a significant increase in night flights and flights generally over north county Dublin in recent years

and it is not accurate to say that this has always been the case (as has been stated by those defending the DAAs position).

People fear that given the planning stipulations set down in 2007 have been flouted so brazenly, how far will the DAA go and will the result be unlimited night flights and a long term continuation of flights frequently causing severe noise in our area during the day. People are distressed and are rightfully concerned for their future and the future of their family in the area.

- 3. What should happen to address people's concerns:
- The Relevant Action should not be approved as it would be extremely damaging for all our communities.
- Acceptance of the Relevant Action by ABP and thus retention of the flightpaths – would set a dangerous precedent that ABP conditions should be ignored if inconvenient.
- An oral hearing is absolutely necessary given the gravity of the situation.

The tens of thousands of people in North County Dublin should be listened to and our voices should be heard. We are the ones being impacted by the DAAs decisions. It is not a binary "either / or" decision between the economic health of our airport and the health of people in North County Dublin. We can have a thriving airport and also respect the rights of the people living in North County Dublin.
