Dear Secretary,

I ask you to please refuse permission to DAA Relevant Action for the following reasons:

I & my family have lived here in Old Portmarnock since the late 1970s. Since then we have spent many thousands of euro expanding & improving our home & garden. I am used to the passage of aircraft coming & going in the sky to the south of our house & garden for the past 50+ years.

Since the opening of the north runway I have found that the flight paths of many aircraft seem to be erratic. There have been times when big aircraft taking off easterly on the south runway have flown directly above our house. This never happened before. Historically there was a path where aircraft followed east /west/ east over the Portmarnock Railway station — now it seems that on a regular basis aircraft wander to a path north of that line closer to our house.

Some aircraft taking off seem to veer north easterly over the trotting track/ Lakeside Memorial Park (just north behind our house). Surely such a change of direction should be made after the aircraft is out over the sea.

Ever since the north runway was opened my wife wakes up most nights to the sound of aircraft & then spends endless time watching the "Flight Radar" site tracking the coming & going at the airport. Example: there are regular double/ triple flights from Ethiopia landing at around 4am/4.30am & a short time later they would lift off heading across the Atlantic. Are such flights part of the quota of night flights agreed in the planning permission?

We were led to believe all that flights would land & take off into the wind & that about 70% of the time that would mean flights would take off into the west. This is not the reality of what is happening. At times flight direction is altered every 3 to 4 hours while the wind direction has not changed. Is this a breach of flight safety?

Some years ago I sought FCC planning permission for work on my house in Old Portmarnock. I received comment from Dublin Airport and I adhered to the permission. Is it too much to expect that DAA also adhere to the permission agreed?
