

The NTA clearly does not understand the consequences of expanding the Grange Road into the Woodland area of Rathfarnham Castle Park. This area is a very important amenity for many people, especially autistic children, for whom it is a calming, regulating environment.

It has a fantastic range of wildlife, especially protected wild birds, bats, frogs, bees, ducks and squirrels. It is a calm, peaceful, natural play space with a wonderful Woodland Playground.

I am a teacher and have worked with numerous autistic and neurodiverse children. I have seen first hand through my work the incalculable benefits of a play space which meets sensory needs. In this case, as it comprises a quiet, natural haven, it cannot readily be replaced. This area is loved by all children, my own included. It hosts a wide variety of wildlife, particularly wild birds and squirrels. Construction work would destroy it permanently.

The significance of this lovely quiet play space and nature reserve should not simply be disregarded, as the NTA is proposing. Please consider the importance of this particular area for the community. Thank you.
