



BusConnects Templeogue / Rathfarnham to City Centre CBC proposals and planning application Impact on Rathfarnham Castle Park

Dear Sirs,

We have received your correspondence inviting us to make a final written submission on this matter, following the NTA response to submissions. We confirm our objection to the proposal to widen the Grange Road into the Woodland area of Rathfarnham Castle Park.

In our view the NTA has not appreciated the importance of the Woodland area to people in the community. The Woodland is a vital amenity for many people, especially autistic children, for whom it is a calming, regulating environment. It has an extensive range of wildlife, especially protected wild birds, bats, frogs, bees, ducks and squirrels. It is a calm, peaceful, natural play space with a wonderful Woodland Playground. Our grandchildren love this area.

It is a very successful breeding area especially for frogs, bats, squirrels, tufted ducks, and mallards. It should be appreciated as a peaceful wildlife habitat, not turned into a construction site as that will cause it to no longer be a successful breeding habitat for these protected species.

In our view, the proposals to widen the Grange Road over a substantial part of the Woodland area of Rathfarnham Castle Park are excessive and entirely unnecessary. This area is so important for both wildlife and children, especially autistic and neurodiverse children. Unnecessarily destroying up to 10 metres of a beautiful woodland habitat and peaceful natural play space would be an appalling and retrograde step.
