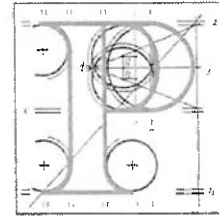

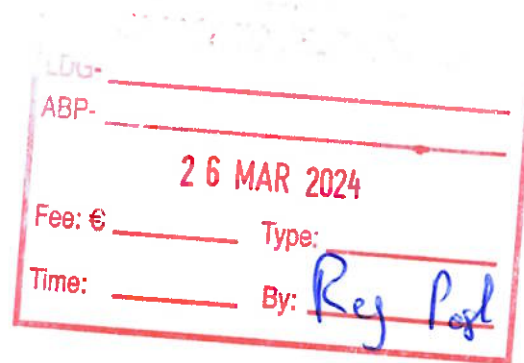

Dear Sir / Madam

We are writing to outline our **objections to the proposed Construction Compound TR3** to be located at Dodder View Road/Church Lane/Woodview Cottages.

This involves the extension of the existing temporary compound installed for the purpose of the Dodder Greenway within the **architectural conservation area** (as identified in red on the map enclosed) for works to be conducted during the construction of the Bus Connections project.

Existing Temporary Site for use with Dodder Greenway

The existing temporary site, planning for which was granted for the purpose of building a stretch of the Greenway project - is now 'offensive', with the surrounding vegetation overgrown and unkept.

All local residents (elderly to new born) have already been subjected to huge inconveniences, health, wildlife and eco effects - noise (diggers, bulk heads being swoped over, gravel being loaded/unloaded, stones being broken up etc - early morning to late at night), pollution, high levels of dust outside, in our houses, gardens and on vehicles to name but a few, due to the existing site.

The original agreement stated that the temporary site has to be reinstated on completion of the relevant stretch of the Dodder Greenway : date of commencement 17/02/2020 – the project is already going on for longer than planned – we have not been advised of a revised date of completion nor any application for the extension of planning permission for this site !

Our objections and huge concerns of the detrimental effects and suitability of Construction Compound TR3 (See image Page 6) are – not comprehensive but include the following:

Flood Plane

Proposed site is directly across the road and just metres away from an OPW acknowledged flood plane (ref. www.floodinfo.ie - Flood Map - Rathfarnham, South Dublin Dublin 14, Leinster, D14 P6CO, Ireland).

The proposed site is on the same level as the site in use at present which is already showing signs of flooding on the hardcore base constructed for this site which is inhibiting drainage and putting more pressure on the existing 'soakage' area.

Extending the site in a flood plane area, with 2 rivers in the immediate area and an old one underground, would be disastrous, particularly with any increase in rainfall due to more extreme weather conditions expected in the future. Any further flooding (caused from change of use in the grassland and 'soakage' area would be inevitable and putting numerous residents and houses at tremendous risk.

Archaeological & Heritage

This area of Rathfarnham is of particular Historic and Architectural importance. The proposed site will be just meters from local heritage sites e.g.:

- a) The ancient Rathfarnham Graveyard which contains the ruins of a medieval church whose origins date back to the 13th century.
- b) Rathfarnham Paper Mill which dates back to at least the 18th century - the proposed site occupies the area of the original Mill Pond.
- c) Numerous others as references in local history books/materials.

The scale of the proposed site will erode part of the cultural heritage of Rathfarnham.

Biodiversity / Ecosystems / Area of Natural Beauty

Bushy Park woodlands and extended area to Rathfarnham Castle & Park and along the Dodder are an area of natural beauty, a haven for wildlife and biodiversity with several bat species, heronry, badgers, otters, small mammal species and numerous others together with superb flora and fauna. Spider Hill (existing site and proposed extended site) is renowned for its abundant and spectacular display of daffodils every year.

Residence at Woodside cottages, The Mill, Thornville and surrounding area have already noticed the impact on, and decrease in the presence of wildlife, flora and fauna since the commencement and ongoing use of the existing temporary site created for the construction of the local section of the Greenway (2020). The noise, pollution and destroying the large grassland area by filling it in with hardcore to create a depot/site to access and accommodate heavy commercial vehicles has, attributed hugely to this and habitat loss.

So much so that DCC have temporary Closure of Bushy Park Woodlands Paths to tackle these issues.

Public Amenity

This area is already zoned for residential (local houses and apartments) and community recreational use.

In addition a stretch of the Dodder Greenway Route – the project to develop a greenway of international renown, on par with the best greenways in the world, to be attractive and enhance environment, has recently been constructed along the Dodder Valley and linked with Busy Park - is directly in front of the proposed site.

Mental Health and Wellbeing

Area used recreationally for all ages, walks, training, picnics etc. the proposed site would completely remove this facility for all – the areas has already been compromised and any further development would lead to health, social and wellbeing consequences.

Local Economy

Impact to businesses in Rathfarnham village and Historical Rathfarnham Castle & Park. The village would no longer be attractive for public visiting Bushy Park and cycling the new Dodder Greenway with the obstruction, of a SITE, to access the village via Church Lane/Spider Hill which has been used throughout numerous decades.

Danger to Public Safety

With the narrowing of the roadway following the creation of the cycle greenway the use of compound / heavy commercial vehicles along this stretch of road (Rathfarnham/ Terenure junction to Tesco Rathfarnham junction and beyond) would endanger the safety of the public driving, walking and cycling.

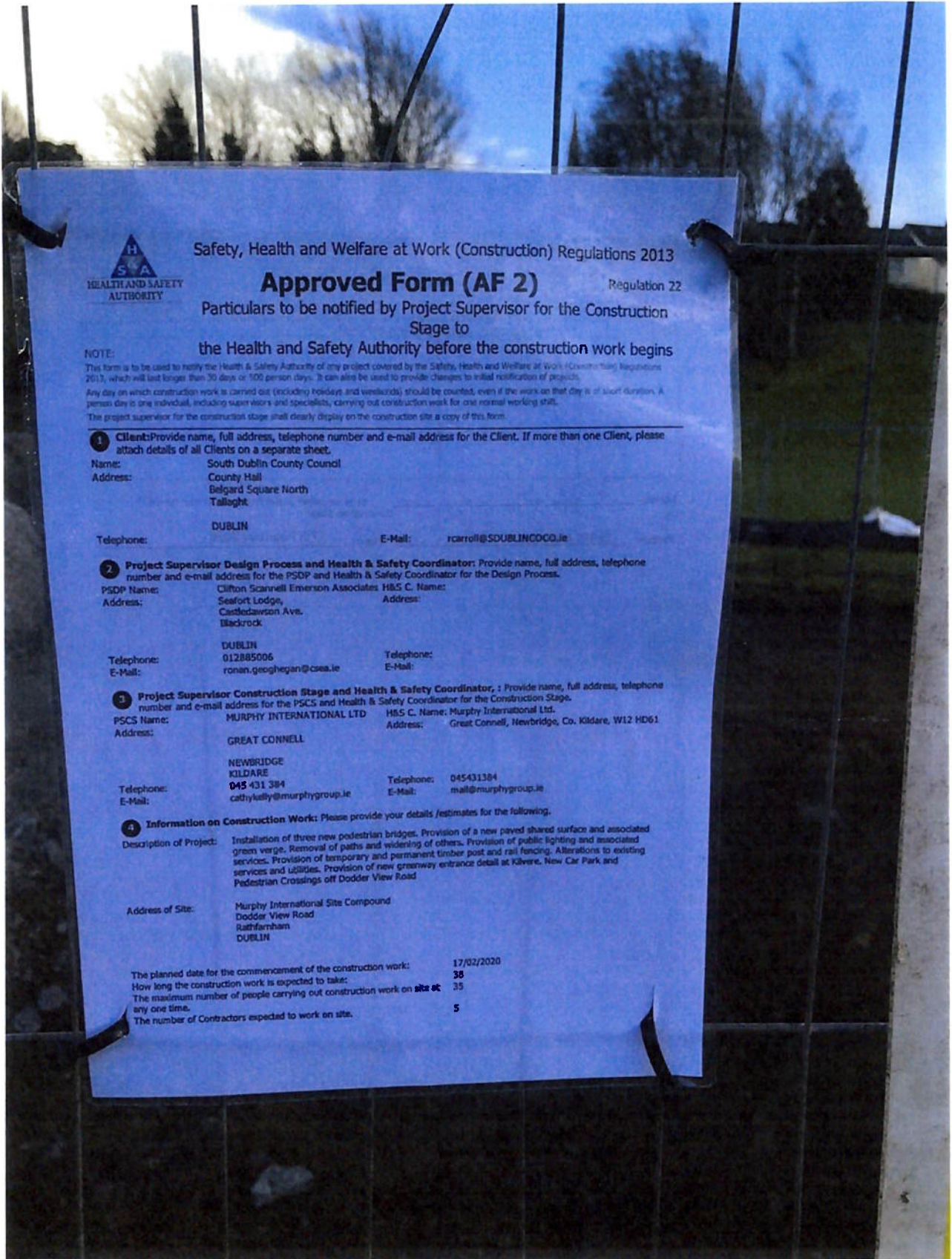
We re-iterate that we are bringing this to your attention as the consequences would be detrimental to the well-being of all in our community and is of huge concern to us for our community and environment.

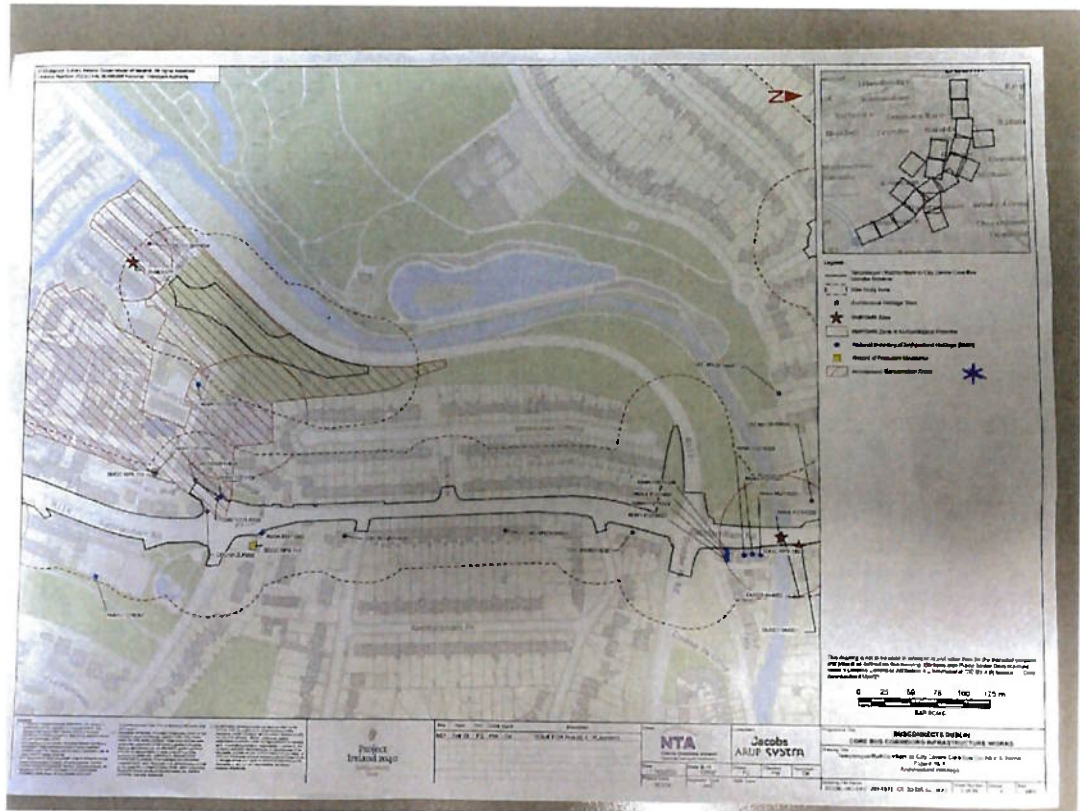


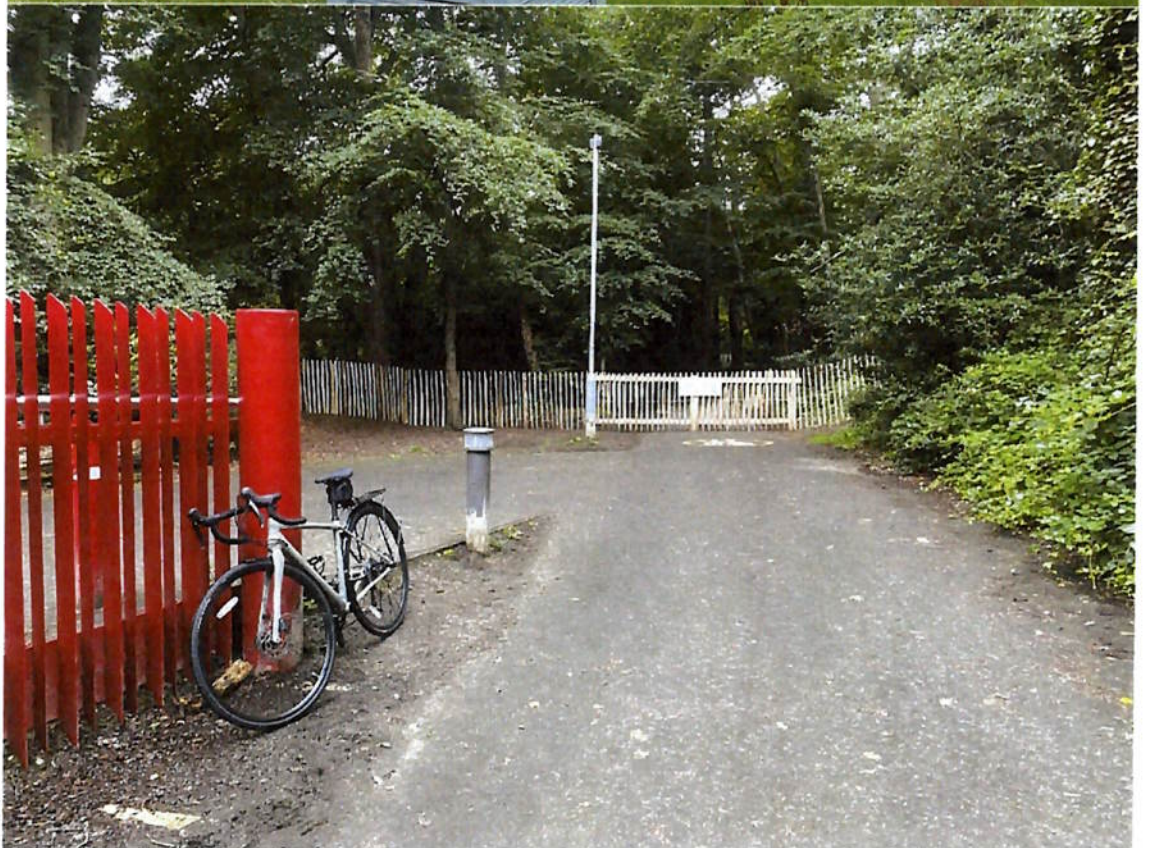

Bushy Park Woodlands

Dublin City Council (DCC) Parks, Biodiversity and Landscape Services wish to advise the public of the Temporary Closure of Woodlands Paths, over Summer 2023.

Bushy Park woodlands are a haven for wildlife & biodiversity within our urban landscape, we have several bat species and a heronry located within the woodlands, and there are also badgers and other small mammal species who call this home. These woodlands are heavily used by the general public, which is contributing to the deterioration of the structure & biodiversity of the woods.

Recently DCC parks undertook Phase 1 of a Tree Care Program to tackle these issues. This was due for completion in Spring 2023 but has been delayed due to the disturbance it was causing to wildlife & because of the identification of several stands of Japanese Knot Weed. Unfortunately Phase 1 maintenance of trees cannot continue at present.

Therefore, until works can be completed & for the safety of the general public, pathways & areas of concern will be temporarily closed.

Fences will be erected and the public are asked to refrain from entering these areas.
