

Dear Sir / Madame,

I have already submitted an objection to the manner in which the Bus Connects plan, were it to be implemented, would cause dreadful problems for the people in this neighbourhood. The most egregious element of it would be a 24/7 bus gate at Terenure Library (which building is going to be reconstructed in the near future we hope). To get by car from the M50 to Terenure would be an extremely difficult business as the right hand turn at Rathdown would also be closed off as would Greenlea Road. Terenure Road West would be the only option left and as it stands, it is one long traffic jam every morning with parents dropping their kids to school en route to their workplace. The cycle lanes outside St. Joseph's BNS would be done away with and we (as teachers there) have, over the years put endless effort into promoting cycling to school.

There are a lot of schools in this neighbourhood and parents tend to take in the school / creche drop as they head off to work in places like St. Vincent's Hospital, Donnybrook, U.C.D., Ballsbridge, Stillorgan etc. I know many such parents. The new bus service S4 is terrific for students travelling to U.C.D. but it's not practicable for parents who have small children to deliver to the schools and creches in the neighbourhood.

Tremendous effort has gone in to making the villages of Terenure and Rathgar etc. feel like village communities (the 15 min. city idea) but if Bus Connects take precedence as is planned, the village community that we strive to establish will be totally eroded. We have a very good bus service as it stands.
