

Dear Eimear,

Many thanks for your correspondence which I received on the 25th February regarding Bus Connects Templeogue/Rathfarnham to City Centre. As previously stated I, Stephanie Frame, and my wife Mary McKenna, of 78 Highfield Road, Rathgar, Dublin 6, D06P4V2, strongly object to the proposed new right hand turn on Upper Rathmines Road onto Highfield Road. The reason for this is that the current out going traffic from the city centre, which currently goes up Rathgar road is in excess of 10,000 vehicles (this figure was presented to us by the Fine Gael counsellors at a town hall meeting in Terenure parish hall late last year). Highfield Road is half the length and half the width of Rathgar Road and this additional traffic will bring the road to a stand still. The road has recently been exposed to an additional 12 buses an hour going up and down the road as a result of the Bus Corridor, which in the main are empty, and has resulted in increased noise pollution, let alone fuel pollution on the road, and wastage of tax payers money.

In addition, how has Rathgar road been granted a one way system in isolation of the bigger plan mid way through the process? Surely this is not acceptable! Highfield Road is not a suitable road to carry an additional 10,000 vehicles daily; the noise, the gridlock, and the environmental impact would be extraordinary.

Please bare in mind the bigger picture whilst considering making Rathgar road a one way, and destroying Highfield Road.
