At: Lackeragh and Garranereagh, Lisarda and Barnadivane (Kneeves), Terelton, Co. cork.

I would like to raise an objection for the following planning and personal reasons.

My partner lives in the area and we have spent significant time reviewing all the reports regarding this planning application and I can assure, you as a very regular visitor to the area, that this application along with the existing wind farm is going to have a huge impact on all aspects of the locality. Despite what the reports say, the visual impact will be devastating. Despite what the landowners say, our animals can feel the vibrations in the earth and don't like it. The evidence of this is the number of dead animals on the roads in the area since the turbines were put up. They're everywhere, running from the hills and on to the roads and getting killed. I must say, the Cork county planners don't seem concerned by all the complaints and objections and local concerns about those god awful monstrous worthless turbines to be put up. As a side note, couldn't you just force all builders to put up solar panels on all houses built?

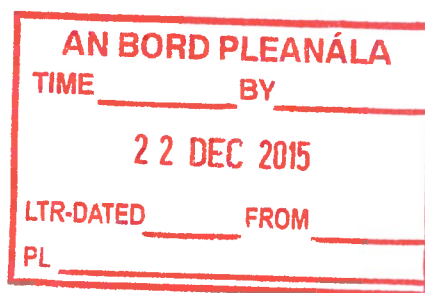
Maybe offer massive funding for people to put up their own solar panels?

I refer to previous correspondence regarding the above. The Planning Authority has been notified by An Bord Pleanála that an appeal has been lodged against its decision in this case.

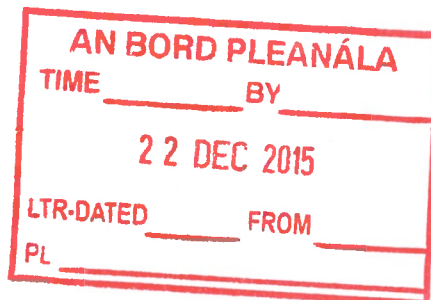
