

## Submission to An Bord Pleanala on proposed closure of Ballycoskery (Ballyhea Village) railway crossing

Case number NA04.310286

Dear Sir,

I wish to make this submission to An Bord Pleanala in relation to the above proposed development at Ballycoskery (Ballyhea Village), Ballyhea, Co. Cork.

The proposed bridge and other works at Ballyhea Village are unsuitable for our village and make the village unworkable from the point of view of getting from one side of the village to the other. The scale and proportion of these works make a negative impact on the landscape and the environment as well as well as on the social cohesion of the village.

In 2010 our views were made known to CIE and Cork County Council about a similar bridge. They included noise levels, loss of green space, bridge situated too close to houses and the school, and devaluation of property. All of those issues were then accepted as reasonable by Cork County Council and are still valid.

In 2011 the bridge did not go ahead because Cork County Council took into account these concerns and refused permission to proceed with this application. Cork County Council advised CIE to draw up an alternative to the proposed bridge.

The proposal now submitted for Ballycoskery to An Bord Pleanala is basically the same plan drawn up in 2010 ignoring the 2011 planning determination of Cork County Council and local concerns. By going to An Bord Pleanala CIE thinks that it can get around the decision of Cork County Council to continue with its proposed bridge. By attempting to obtain compulsory purchase orders for works well beyond the scope of the provisions of the Transport Act, CIE is attempting to create a precedent that will allow major intrusion into the rights of private property.

I ask An Bord Pleanal to uphold the planning decision already made by Cork County Council in 2011 on building a bridge at Ballyhea Village.

I ask an Bord Pleanala to reject the proposal now made by CIE.

I ask an Bord Pleanala to encourage CIE to reexamine the proposal to build a tunnel under the railway line at Ballyhea Village as this would have the support of most people in the village and would be a less of an intrusion. In the event that building a tunnel might prove too costly for CIE I then ask the Bord to encourage CIE to upgrade the present level crossing to four gate CCTV, such as the proposed gate at Ballyhay, and to avail of modern safety technology.

I request an Oral Hearing.
