As some of the hundreds of swimmers, who regularly swim in waters off the Malahide coastline, from Low & High Rock (and who have up to now, enjoyed the healthy pastime of open water swimming all year long, as well as those elite swimmers who regularly train for challenges such as the English Channel, in the waters between Lambay & Low Rock, along the coast between the Velvet strand & Malahide, & to & from Irelands Eye, we wish to object to the above planning Application, Ref: ABP 301908-18

We enclose a cheque for the fee for inclusion as observers in the planning process- €50.00 We understand the proposed treatment is aimedto eventually discharge 13 million litres per hour, by 2050 taking sewage for 2.9 million people.from East Midlands, as well as greater Dublin - the treatment proposed is secondary, only (not terrtiary), as behaves a modern society As all year round swimmers, we are aware of the impacts of even minor breaches in the sewage system can have on the water quality here; we can literally taste the poor water quality when swimming & are acutely aware of even minor discharge issues, as they ocurr, up to now. Therefore we are dismayed at the prospect of the discharge of particles waste & basically treated sewage matter to further pollute the seas we swim in - discharge of this magnitude will close down our habitual swimming venues, & reduce the seas to dead media into which no swimmer can safely swim in

The waters of the Irelands Eye, Lambay & Malahide coastline are of pivotal importance as they also contain spawning grounds of some of our fish species

Therefore, we wish in particular to voice our repugnance to this threat to our coast, the sea lifestyle, & to the SAC & SPos around this section of the Fingal north fringe -
