

Dear Secretary,

The committee and members of the Howth Sea Angling Club strongly object to the proposed Wastewater Treatment Plant at Clonshaugh and pipeline from Blanchardstown to Ireland's Eye, on the following grounds.

Environmental: We are concerned at the effects of such a large volume of so called 'treated' water intended to be pumped into sea water and the chemicals it may contain, the proposed pipeline outflow enters the sea at an area just off Irelands Eye. Even with a guarantee of tertiary treatment, if operational procedures were to fail, the discharge of raw sewage to the sea can only result in an environmental disaster. The effects on the coastline, flora and fauna and designated shellfish waters, in what should be a protected area, would prove to be catastrophic.
