Ringsend Plant I have to say
that similar Assurance were given
When the Plant at Ringsend was Being
Proposed I.E.

1. Smell we were told there would
be no Smells coming from the Plant
2. Water Contaminant

To Prevent any Contamination of Dublin Bay
and Liffey Waters and our Beaches
especially the Shelly Banks would be
Protected from Pollution.

Poolbeg Peninsula was an area
of Great Natural Beauty and
a Popular Bathing Place for our
People

We engaged a Marine Engineer
Who advised us and the City
Council that the Plant was not
fit for Purpose as designed

Our Protests were ignored
The Plant was built the High
Pressure Pipe at Sutton Burst
and Flooded St Vincent's School
in Sutton with Raw Sewage

A Delegation from the E.U.
Came at our Request including
M.E.P. and Deputy President Marshall
Mr Guinness. We began to find
the Beach littered with condoms
and Sanitary Tissues

All concerned now agree
that our engineer was R. A.
