Dear Sir/Madam,

We wish to strongly object as we have done since the beginning of this process to the proposal by the greater Dublin drainage project to build a monster sewage plant close to the AUL grounds on Clonshaugh Road. The plant at its full capacity will be the size of 4 Croke Park's and will take sewage from various parts of the city and from Meath and Kildare.

Our concern is the sheer size of what is being proposed, the disruption that this is going to cause to the local neighbourhoods during the construction phase over a number of years. If there is an accident in a plant of this scale what impact will this happen on the local residents. It is felt that property prices will drop in the area.

There will be odour problems with this proposed treatment plant. It poses a huge health and safety risk. Residents living in the vicinity of the plant will be unable to open the windows of their houses or go outside. Currently the residents living beside the Ringsend treatment plant have major problems with the odours emanating from it.

The plant is to also take sewage from Kildare and Meath. This makes no economic sense. Instead smaller plants should be built to accommodate waste in these counties.

There is huge opposition from residents living in Clonshaugh, Riverside, Belcamp, Darndale, Belmayne, Clare Hall, Balgriffin and Portmarnock to what they feel is a project being dumped on them.

At a minimum and for the sake of democracy, ABP should hold an oral hearing.
