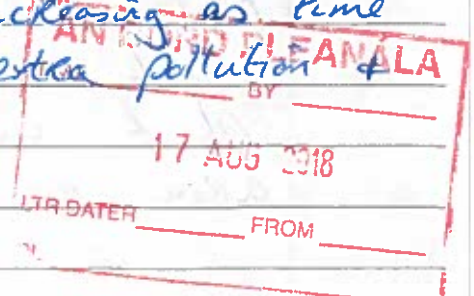

To Whom it may concern:

As a Resident in the combining area of Clonsillaugh and Coolock, I wish to make my objection to the proposed building of a giant sewage plant situated on R139 formerly N32.

At present the traffic has increased tremendously with the addition of new homes in the Belmoyne Belltree, Parkside, Clonsillaugh, apartments on Malahide Road opposite, raising home and garden homes also in progress at Belcamp Manor. All this adds to traffic congestion in and out of Donaghmede, going to and from Clonsillaugh Ave, Northcross M50. This is all before the trucks start arriving on a daily basis and increasing as time goes on, which in turn adds to extra pollution & possible accidents.



This plant will treat a great deal of waste product. Vents will be ~~opened~~ opened and gases released into the air, causing smells, not to nice. Also, there is also the possibility of tiny particles of faecal matter being released, which will be in the air and people will be breathing. So being released into the air is, fumes, faecal matter and chemicals used to ~~wash~~ wash sewage before being emptied into the Irish Sea at Portmarnock.

The outfall for the water waste is at Portmarnock, Our beautiful Velvet Strand, where visitors to North County Dublin like to walk and take in views. My fear is that this will no longer be. Our Blue Flag maybe lost. Our Coastline & beaches will be ruined and damaged. The chemicals used to clean the sewage will greatly disrupt the endocrine system of fish, birds, mammals and then further damage the fishing industry in Howth and surrounding areas and businesses linked.

I feel that education, health facilities, metro north and homes should receive the greatest priority. Building this giant sewage plant will greatly take away from the area as a good place to live and will

add to the hardship trying to re-establish
the area.

I would ask that An Bord Pleanála to review
this proposal again in light of the issues and
concerns highlighted.
