A chara,

In relation to the first party response to the third party appeal on lands adjacent to Huntstown Power Station, Hunstown, North Road, Finglas Dublin 11, ABP ref. 3133583, I wish to make the follow comments:

- As previously stated in my original submission, further data centres jeopardise our energy security, water infrastructure and climate targets. In the last week alone, two amber alerts were issued on the electricity market. The Commission for the Regulation of Utilities has said that a raised number of such alerts are to be expected over the next number of years. In that context, before a winter where blackouts are highly likely, I am of the view that this level of increased demand on our antiquated power supply is not sustainable and that the Board should overturn Fingal County Council's decision in an effort to safeguard our energy security.
- The applicant failure to meaningfully address the appellants request for a strengthening of condition three of Fingal County Council's decision to grant permission is concerning. I do not accept the applicants contention that "it would not be practical to stipulate the timing and delivery of these renewable projects by way of a planning condition". The State has very ambitious climate targets to meet by 2030, therefore it should be incumbent on all data centre developments to ensure that new renewable energy projects are fully operational before data centres commence operating. I do not believe that efforts to offset the energy consumption of data centres can be delayed. Measures to provide net zero data centres should be clearly agreed during the planning stage and in place on or before data centres begin operating.

I would appreciate if the above concerns could be considered and I would again urge the Board to refuse permission in this case.
