Re: Dart + West Project Newcomen Bridge (Case Reference: 314232)

To whom it may concern:

Fáilte Ireland, the National Tourism Development Authority, inputted to Dart+ Programme consultations that larnrod Eireann held in relation to the proposed rail improvements for the Greater Dublin Area (GDA).

Failte Ireland is supportive of the programme and its objectives. We have already made a submission in relation to the proposed programme to this effect. We note the electrification plans of the DART+ West to Maynooth/M3 Parkway and the proposed enhancements at Connolly Station to allow for increased train numbers per hour which is welcomed. The line runs adjacent to the Royal Canal and the Royal Canal Greenway currently runs from Maynooth to Longford which is Ireland's longest greenway at 130km.

Fáilte Ireland are working with members of the tourism industry & relevant stakeholders to unlock the commercial potential that these Canal networks (Royal and Grand Canals) can offer visitors and local communities.

To develop a compelling and enhanced tourism experience of the canals (e.g. connecting these canals with the with the River Shannon and Dublin Docklands), the navigational traffic should ideally enable visitors to travel along their preferred routes without too many restrictions.

However, the potential opportunity that the Canals offer for the development of tourism along these 3 significant waterways is curtailed in part because of the intricate operational issues involved in 'lifting' the Newcomen Bridge - which restricts the flow of canal navigation along the Royal Canal.

We would request that Iarnród Éireann would take the opportunity of this new works programme to examine how the navigational flow on the canal could be improved in terms of making it as free-flowing as possible.

As the National Tourism Development Authority, Fáilte Ireland would like to ensure that visitors expectations are met, which would boost local rural economies along the route and support local communities.

I wish to confirm that Waterways Ireland have made a submission and inputted into the consultation held by laranrod Éireann concerning the **Dart + West Railway Order Project**.
