

Dear Sirs,

I refer to the above proposed development and the proposed route the cable is taking. Please see the attached map outlining the cable route - map 11 printed form the planning application for your convenience & a photos of the area which we have taken.

Travelling northwards this map shows the cable route crossing a road, there is a X indicating where the planning notice was erected. This is parallel to our house Eircode P12DE26. The cable will be too near our property being approx 5m from the western side of the building, leaving no option for us to extend the house which we are in the process of looking into. There are two sheds (which are not marked on their map) located on the left hand side of this road, one just before the house & the other just after. The entrances to these sheds are also along the proposed route. We were neither consulted or approached by the company on this matter. I believe they should seek an alternative & more direct route which already exists. We have highlighted this option in green on the photos attached. By taking this more direct route our concerns would be eased and the value of our property would remain. Common sense must prevail in this instance so that the least amount of disturbance would be caused in the area.

Also the road outlined for the grid connection on 0013 is the main road to another shed which is used on a daily basis for feeding livestock. Sheep & cattle are walked/driven up to the shed so ongoing health checks can be carried out & addressed. There is no other road access to this shed. If the planning application is successful we would appreciate if the company could keep us informed when going for a road opening licence from Cork County Council.

I would appreciate if you could take our concerns and suggestions on board during your decision making.
