Our client wishes to ensure that the retained lands, particularly those to the east of the proposed Metrolink can come forward for development in advance or in tandem with the proposed Metrolink Scheme. 2	Letter	1	The attached map shows an area of CPO (Compulsory Purchase Order) permanent land take to the east of the proposed Metrolink, which our client feels is unnecessary and excessive for the proposed Metrolink scheme.	Till understand that the land being referred to is that coloured turquoise shown by Figure A. Til do not agree that the requested lands are unnecessary or excessive. The land take will be required for MetroLink construction phase as explained by EIAR Chapter 21, Landtake, Table 21.6 Construction Phase Land Take Impact Assessment and will be required to support construction of the M50 Motorway viaduct section and to accommodate part of the construction compound No. 3. Further details on the construction of the M50 motorway viaduct are presented in Section 5.9.2 M50 Viaduct of the EIAR Chapter 5 (MetroLink Construction Phase), and the phasing of the works is detailed further in Section 7 of the EIAR Appendix 5.3 (Construction Sequence Report).	
3	Letter	1	In addition, the retained lands in this area could not come forward for development in a timely fashion, or at all, as the retained lands in this area are only shown on the scheme drawing as having access to the existing dwelling house, where Mr. Hugo Byrne currently resides.  On behalf of our client we are currently seeking change to the access arrangements and the area of permanent land take as set out in Figure A attached.  We are on behalf of our client in ongoing with Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII) in respect to these proposed changes and significant progress was made in respect to same in recent weeks.  We would hope an agreement will be put in place between our client and TII over the coming weeks that might resolver our client concerns.
